Governor's Executive Order 25-09

Requirements of all public schools:

- Ban student cell phone use during the entire school day
- District must create policy by October 31, 2025
- Full implementation required by January 1, 2026







Devices, including cell phones and wireless headphones/early set be packed into backpacks or particle of phone holders during in the lattice of the lattice



Classro



allways & Restrooms

Devices will not be allowed in hallways or restrooms during class.



Passing Time & Lunch

Students may use phones during passing time and lunch.



BSD's plan determined & announced in spring 2025:

General Guidelines

- All students are required to "pack or park" their cell phones and electronic devices (smart watches and earbuds), during the school day as determined by level.
- "Pack" means storing the device in a backpack, locker, or other designated area.
- "Park" means placing the device in a designated area within the classroom or school premises.

2025-2026 School Year Expectations





Pack It or Park It

All personal electronic devices — including cell phones, earbuds, headphones and smartwatches, must be stored in backpacks or parked in lockers during the school day.



Bell to Bell

Devices must be off and away from the first bell to the last bell of the school day — including restroom breaks, passing time and lunchtime. Requests for exemptions should be discussed with school counselors.



Before and After School

Students may use devices before and after school.

Purpose

- Create a focused, distraction-free learning environment
- Prioritize student mental health and well-being
- Encourage strong peer and student-teacher interactions
- Strive to keep students engaged, focused, and challenged to reach their full potential
- Stay updated on research about the impact of personal electronic devices and adopt best practices as they evolve

Response & Exceptions

Response for Non-Compliance:

• Students who do not comply with this policy or the personal electronic device requirements of their school may be subject to consequences as outlined in the district's Student Code of Conduct, including having their personal electronic devices held for parent pick-up.

Exceptions:

- Compliance with a student's individualized education plan (IEP), 504 plan, or other requirement to access the educational programming or communication at school
- Emergency situations as determined by school staff



Implementation & Review

Implementation:

- Teachers, staff, and administrators are responsible for teaching about and enforcing this policy with students.
- School administration will provide clear communication to students and parents/guardians regarding the policy and its importance and will provide follow-through with school consequences.

Review and Revision:

• The Governor's order includes several specific provisions that must be in board policy. A recommended update to board policy will be presented as a separate agenda item.
