Update for January:

Skyward: We've made it to our first deadline. Everyone is doing their part and after meeting with our Skyward project manager, she has said we are on the right track. That is positive. It will start to get very intense over the next few months as more training and setup will take place.

I've filed the RFP's for this year's Erate projects. This will be for Wireless Access Points and Switches. Basically the core of what makes the district function. We are still in the 28 day bidding period and I've started to receive bids.

We are testing out software called NinjaOne. It's a product that monitors all of our laptops and makes sure that we are up to date with patches and updates. We have not had a good system to keep track of all of this. With cyber security being highly important, we thought it would be a good idea to find a product to help us out with this task. We have it approved to be paid though the cyber security grant money if we decide to purchase.

Mr. Ludvigson and I have been reviewing copier usage in the district. We met with our Marco rep to go over this year's review. We are still using the same if not more copies, but our color usage will be more in line for what we prepurchased for copies. We have been having issues with our Elementary office copier, as it's undersized for the amount of copies it makes. We will be upgrading that machine this spring to accommodate the increased workload.

I'm working with Mr. Young and Mr. Rud on updating some cameras at the Secondary school. We are also looking at purchasing vape detectors for all bathrooms. Some of the money for this project will be coming out of our security grant.
