

Pathways Schools: Elementary Timeline

- Band and orchestra "round robin" experiences
- Digital Learning
 Specialist-design
 and coding units
- Support for makerspaces
- K-5 math curriculum pilot

Year 2

- Theater-Performing Arts
 artist-in-residence
- Health & Well-Being career activities
- Project-based learning entrepreneurship: training and planning
- K-5 math curriculum implementation

Year 3

- Project Based
 Learning entrepreneurship implementation
- K-5 math curriculum implementation
- Science curriculum review (Next Generation Science Standards)
- AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination)
 Elementary for intermediate

- Align with research-based model for effective middle schools

- Provide systems to support unique social-emotional needs and culture of young adolescents
- Build an explicit bridge to High School Pathways
- Support advanced learners

Schedule

- Teaming Model: team of teachers with common students
- Block schedule to reduce number of transitions
- Flexible time blocks for extended learning
- Intervention/Enrichment directly linked to core

Current

- 9 periods daily
- Advisory
- English Language Arts
 (ELA) and Communication
 separate classes
- Blaze time intervention
- Science daily
- Social Studies daily
- 2 electives daily

Proposed

- 5 Periods daily
- Advisory
- English Language Arts (ELA) and Communication block daily
- Math block daily
- Science alternating days
- Social Studies alternating days
- 2 electives daily



Exploratory and Electives

- Aligned to High School Pathways curriculum
- Courses areas are the same with content redesign
- Same opportunities at each site
- Offered in half-blocks (45 min) to maximize options

Intervention and Enrichment

- WIN time embedded in Math and English Language Arts block
- Allows for both push in and pull out models
- Utilizes progress monitoring tools for personalization
- Enrichment in Honors courses and WIN (What I Need) time

- Blaze Time
 - Math 180
 - Blaze Math
 - Tier II Intervention Math
 - AVID Elective (All Grades)
- Read 180 (Communications)

Proposed

- WIN time
 - Embedded in ELA and Math Blocks
- Math Intervention
 - Intervention lessons provided in new curriculum
 - Read 180 During ELA
 WIN portion of block



Social Emotional Learning (SEL) & Transition

- SEL curriculum Phase 3 of development cycle
- Advisory restructure content
- Structured transition for grade 6 and grade 8 students

Timeline Proposal


Year 1
