As always we are truly blessed to be here and to be a part of HHS!

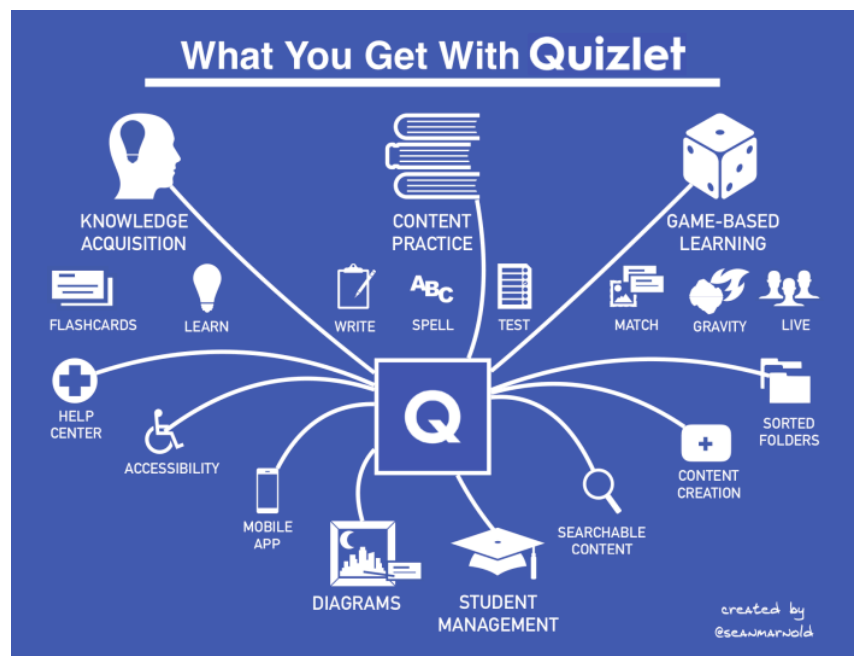

Teacher Corner- Mr Lee- Review Tool “Quizlet” for student success

By using Quizlet, Mr. Lee provides students with an additional resource to reinforce learning outside of direct instruction while supporting a variety of learning styles.

Quizlet is highly engaging and interactive, encouraging active student participation rather than passive review. Students can utilize features such as digital flashcards, practice tests, matching games, and timed review activities that promote recall, critical thinking, and self-assessment. The platform also allows students to study independently or collaborate with peers, making learning both personalized and social. Additionally, Quizlet provides immediate feedback, helping students identify areas of strength and areas that need further practice.

The flexibility of Quizlet allows it to be used for vocabulary development, content review, formative assessment, and exam preparation. It supports differentiated instruction by allowing students to work at their own pace while still aligning with course standards and learning objectives. Mr. Lee’s use of Quizlet reflects purposeful integration of technology to enhance engagement, increase student ownership of learning, and improve academic readiness.
