

Basic Diploma

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A basic diploma is designed for students with specific learning needs. Students seeking this diploma will need to meet identical credit requirements as outlined in Morrow County School District Policy IKF-Standard.

For the class of 2009 and beyond, a Basic Diploma will be awarded when fifty percent(50%) or more of the courses in the four core areas of English, Social Studies, Science, and Mathematics were awarded by specialists with adaptations to content materials, assessment, and grading.

For the class of 2007, a Basic Diploma will be awarded when eighty percent(80%) or more of the courses in the four core areas of English, Social Studies, Science, and Mathematics were awarded by specialists with adaptations to content materials, assessment, and grading.

For the class of 2008, a Basic Diploma will be awarded when seventy percent(70%) or more of the courses in the four core areas of English, Social Studies, Science, and Mathematics were awarded by specialists with adaptations to content materials, assessment, and grading.

In accordance with Oregon State Law, special education students earning a Basic Diploma are eligible for special education transition services to age 21. This will be effective for the graduating class of 2009

Additional requirements as per Policy IKF-Standard (i.e. Educational Plan & Profile, Extended Application, Career-Related Learning and Learning Experiences) are also required.

Certificate of Accomplishment

A certificate of accomplishment is earned when a student completes coursework in a specially designed program that does not meet state or district diploma requirements.
