My interest in education began my senior year of high school when I served as a classroom aid in a center-based program for students with more significant disabilities. This experience ignited my interest in education, specifically related to supporting students with a wide range of disabilities. This passion led me to pursue my doctoral degree in school psychology. I have been a professor in the psychology department at Grand Valley State University for 16 years. In this position, I have worked collaboratively with local school districts to ensure that future school psychologists have the skills and dispositions necessary to be successful in their role in schools.

I have also served on the board of the Michigan Association of School Psychologists since 2016, being elected President twice. I have experience with the day-to-day board duties (e.g., running board meetings, fiscal management, etc.). Listening to both parents and schools, we assisted in crafting legislation that passed both chambers with near unanimous support. This experience reinforced my belief in collaboration and open dialogue, even when it is challenging.

Beyond my professional roles, I have remained involved in my community. I was a Girl Scout Troop Leader for my daughter's troop and am an active parent volunteer in my children's classes at Cummings Elementary School.

I am excited about the opportunity to bring my background in education, leadership, and community service to the Grandville School Board. I am confident that my experience and dedication to student-centered decision making will help drive meaningful improvements in our district. I welcome the opportunity to discuss how my skills can best serve the needs of our students, educators, and families.
