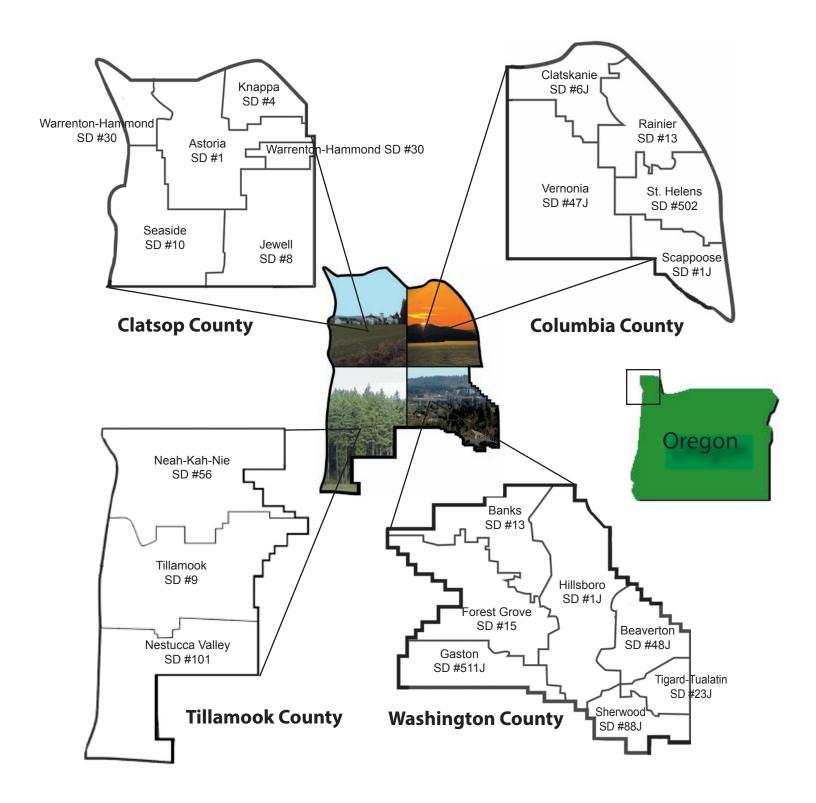

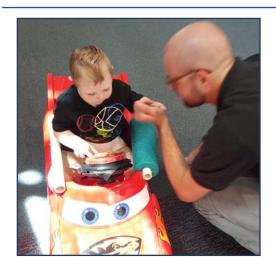
## **ANN SAMUELSON**

## EARLY INTERVENTION/EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION Overview



Component school districts may request evaluation of children, birth to age 5, who have suspected delays for the purpose of determining their eligibility for Early Intervention or Early Childhood Special Education services. The El/ECSE Evaluation Team includes Early Childhood Education Specialists, Speech-Language Pathologists, Occupational Therapists, Physical Therapists, and School Psychologists. Evaluations include a review of existing information and developmental, speech, language, behavior, and psychological assessments, if needed. Evaluations are classified as File Review (review of existing records only), Partial Evaluation (only one developmental area assessed), or Full Evaluation (two or more developmental areas assessed). Language interpretation services are used with families who are not fluent in English.

## Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

## **TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2014-15**

- Transitioned 644 children to kindergarten on September 1, 2015:
  - Clatsop County: 47 children
  - Columbia County: 45 children
  - Tillamook County: 27 children
  - Washington County: 545 children
- Completed 2,255 early intervention/early childhood special education evaluations: an increase of 64 evaluations over the previous school year.
- Trained all early intervention/early childhood special education staff on strategies around the prevention and de-escalation of behavior that interferes with learning.
- Participated in the creation and implementation Early Learning Washington County Hub.

## **KEY FOCUS AREAS FOR 2015-16**

- Continue to implement Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) for all early intervention/early childhood special education programs.
- Introduce the Collaborative Problem Solving model to the early intervention/early childhood special education staff.
- Continue to create new partnerships with community preschools to provide services for children enrolled in the early childhood special education programs throughout the region.
- Continue to increase child find activities, ensuring that eligible children and their families have access to services.
- Relocate the Woodside Early Childhood Center to the Nimbus Corporate Park that will support the increase number of children being served in the Beaverton-area. The new site will be named Beaverton Early Childhood Center.

## Overview

Related Services supports children from birth to age 21, specifically designed to provide access to specialists with training and experience in working with students with autism spectrum disorder (ASD), orthopedic impairments, vision impairments, hearing impairments, speech language impairments, and those who are medically fragile.

Programs and services include: assessments to determine special education eligibility and education planning, audiology, physical and occupational therapy, speech/language, specialized classrooms for deaf and hard of hearing students, and itinerant services (educational consultation and direct services) for students who are blind/visually impaired, deaf and hard of hear¬ing, or have severe orthopedic impairments, and American Sign Language interpreters.

## Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

## TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2014-15

- Audiology staff provided a smooth process for evaluations via contracted services to districts, and a full spectrum of services to the EI/ECSE program through a sub-grant.
- Speech/Language staff successfully implemented Neuro-semantic Programing learning systems in their work with students.
- Successful Assistive Technology (AT) support across NWRESD and increased collaborative partnerships with various districts and colleges/universities.
- The Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) Team provided regional leadership in ASD assessment planning/processes, consultation skills training, and parent support efforts.
- School Psychologists supported districts developing the plans for identifying students with learning disabilities using the "Patterns of Strengths and Weaknesses" model.

- Thanks to a new Regional Grant, audiology will increase capacity to provide the following services to eligible children birth to 21: ongoing hearing evaluations (non-eligibility); sound system loans; and low cost hearing aids/ear molds, loaner aids.
- Speech/Language team will implement an interactive online platform for teachers, specialists, and instructional assistants called "Language Function Junction."
- Continued leadership regionally and state-wide in Assistive Technology (AT) support and increased collaborative partnerships with various districts and colleges/universities.
- The autism team will work to build/increase capacity of district teams to successfully conduct evaluations for students suspected of having Autism Spectrum Disorder.
- Increased support for districts to improve student accessibility and success on Smarter Balanced assessments.

## **DEPARTMENT OF SCHOOLS**

## Overview

**Behavioral Programs:** The district provides special education to students in kindergarten through 12th grade with a wide range of specialized classrooms and schools for children with significant developmental, emotional, and behavioral disabilities. Classes operated by NWRESD deliver instruction by licensed teachers and instructional assistants who provide necessary supervision, special education, and related services.

**GED Testing Services**: The ESD offers GED (General Equivalency Diploma) testing to qualified applicants at the district's Regional Office in Hillsboro and at the Columbia Service Center in St. Helens.

**Home School Students Registered Services**: Oregon Revised Statutes require ESDs to provide monitoring services for students whosew parents have chosen home schooling. The online registration system provides access to parents for required paperwork and documentation.

**Northwest Outdoor Science School**: The program gives students opportunities to experience the natural world in an outdoor setting, including Residential Northwest Outdoor Science School Student Participation and Spring Break Northwest Outdoor Science School Student Participation for 5th and 6th graders, Environmental Education Field Studies for 5th - 8th grade classes, and Cascade Education Corps for at-risk high school students.

**ORVED**: Oregon Virtual Education staff work with districts to provide online courses to students who may not have access otherwise, and/or to supplement their education. ORVED courses provide value for districts by accommodating challenging schedules and by supporting students in need of advanced placement.

## Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

## **TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2014-15**

- Behavior Programs: Transition of the PACE Program to Forest Grove School District; Increased areas of communication modes to school districts; Implemented Collaborative Problem Solving training for staff at PACE.
- Safety: Safety in Motion (SIM) and Boundary Invasion training completed by nearly every NWRESD staff member; No Workmen's Compensation time loss claims during 2014-15.
- Facilities: Improved video conferencing and media capabilities in the Washington Rooms at the Regional Office in Hillsboro.

- Behavior Programs: Professional development to include Collaborative Problem Solving, new IEP training, and assessment training.
- Safety: Create a visible safety plan that incorporates better communications; implement an agency-wide wellness program.
- Northwest Outdoor Science School Student Participation: Maintain high enrollment; work to ensure adequate and stable funding; Partner with school districts to increase recruitment of high school students as Northwest Outdoor Science School Student Participation counselors, especially for the spring 2016 session which competes with Smarter Balance testing and graduation requirements.
- ORVED: Finalize accreditation for the program.

## **INSTRUCTIONAL SERVICES**

## Overview

The Instructional Services Department provides support and consultation services in curriculum and staff development as requested by the 20 component school districts. Services are designed to assist districts in meeting the requirements of school reform legislation.

The ELL and Migrant program supports and collaborates with school districts to develop and implement ELL plans that are compliant with state and federal guidelines.

The Professional Development Department provides training and support to school districts focused on school improvement related to Oregon's Education Act for the 21st Century and supports school district staff in implementing professional development activities - providing support and consultation in the area of school improvement, curriculum instruction, and assessment.

## Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

## **TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2014-15**

- Professional Development: Launched a series of training videos for teachers and administrators to understand Oregon's laws and regulations that address teacher evaluation systems; Convened peer review panels to support districts in examining their current evaluation and supports, and; Trained staff in school districts in Columbia County on use of the online tool used to record their required Continuous Improvement Plans (CIPs).
- Educational Equity: Increased the number of NWRESD administrators participating on Equity Teams; Submitted draft Equity and Action Plans to the Oregon Leadership Network (OLN), and; Developed an Equity Advisory Committee comprised of equity directors from school districts across Oregon and held quarterly meetings.
- English Language Learners: Supported the language and academic success of English Language Learners by providing training and/or coaching to 149 teachers and district-level staff in the process for weaving language instruction into content-area teaching, and administering the kindergarten assessment in Spanish for six school districts.
- Migrant Education: Facilitated participation of over 200 students in NWRESD's summer program that focused on
  improving math and reading abilities while also providing an engaging, safe environment for students during
  the summer; Supported 12 students in receiving training through the Project Graduate Program, empowering
  them to prepare for college and apply for scholarships; Provided wrap-around services to a new after-school
  math and reading program for middle school students developed in partnership with the Astoria School District.

- Professional Development: Continue to assist school districts in completing their Continuous Improvement Plans (CIPs), which involve assessing professional practices and charting a course for improvement, and work with the Oregon Department of Education to develop Essential Skills Reading work samples in Spanish and Mandarin.
- English Language Learners: Continue to build capacity for teachers to incorporate language instruction into content-area lessons, and create systems to ensure the implementation and long-term sustainability of giving English Learners the analytical language necessary to meet the demands of the Common Core.
- Migrant Education: Obtain real-time access to school data on migrant students to ensure that services are being provided to those most in need; Ensure that 100 percent of migrant students in our region have access to services and opportunities provided through the NWRESD's Migrant Education Program.

## TECHNOLOGY DEPARTMENT

## Overview

**Services to Schools:** The Technology Services Group (TSG), as a part of Cascade Technology Alliance (CTA), is responsible for the day-to-day computer services for school districts and ESD staff served by Columbia Gorge, Multnomah, Northwest Regional, and Willamette ESDs. Services include Internet connections, printing, network monitoring, file backup, and troubleshooting.

**Software and Application Support:** CTA provides software support to districts for student e-mail accounts, student and fiscal systems, list servers, domain name servers, home school tracking, web development, special education K-12 census tracking, testing services, class registration system, library and textbook management, substitute management and employee absence tracking, online employee testing, background checking service, web-based surveys, and other system-wide data systems.

**Information Services**: CTA provides regional data processing systems to school districts in the areas of finance, human resource management, student information management, and data warehouse systems.

**Instructional Technology, Media, and Videoconferencing:** Teachers and district instructional staff are provided with on-demand access to current, curriculum-relevant instructional videos via web streaming. Staff also consult and train regarding setting up technologically-based instructional systems.

## Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

## **TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2014-15**

- Completed implementation of Edupoint Synergy Student Information System for Salem-Keizer and Yamhill-Carlton School Districts.
- Finished implementation of Destiny Library system for Beaverton and Portland Public School Districts for 2014-15 school year start.
- Implemented network changes within Washington County in response to switch to Comcast Business fiber network.
- Restructured help desks at each Cascade Technology Alliance (CTA) ESD to standardize response and reduce overall costs.

- Release RFP for security audit firm to audit CTA technology systems and services. May partner with larger districts to share the RFP.
- Automate local service plan service ordering and generation of associated contracts.
- Align CTA technology services with NWRESD strategic plan.
- Explore service sharing between CTA and Clackamas ESD.
- Implement Restraint & Seclusion tracking application for participating CTA districts.
- Increase district awareness of CTA services.

## ADMINISTRATIVE AND SUPPORT SERVICES

## Overview

The 2015-16 Local Service Plan calls for administrative and support services for component school districts, including but not limited to services designed to consolidate component school district business functions, liaison services between the Department of Education and component school districts and registration of children being taught by private teachers, parents, or legal guardians pursuant to ORS 339.035.

Administrative services provided within Core include courier, home school, emergency closure services, superintendent services, service center administration, and county allocations. In addition, business services and human resource functions are provided on a contracted basis.

## Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

## **TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2014-15**

- Continued to develop our shared services model to help districts free up resources for the classroom.
- Worked with legislators to rebuild positive awareness of and support for NWRESD.
- Collaborated with component district superintendents to evaluate and implement cost savings in the areas of business and human resource functions.
- Worked alongside our 20 component district superintendents to develop a 2013-14 Local Service Plan that resulted in approval by their boards.
- Coordinated regular media contacts to share positive events and news within the agency.

- Ensure ALL NWRESD administrators are participating in equity training, incorporate equity work into the agency's new strategic plan, and increase the number of equity trainers in the region.
- Support school districts in developing world-class programs in the following areas: Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Career and Technical Education (CTE); College Going; and Early Learning.
- Work successfully with NWRESD member school districts in a manner which will have all 20 districts within the region participating as full members of the ESD no later than July 1, 2016.
- Enhance instructional services and professional development to the agency, component districts, and early childhood providers and partners, such that the services are high quality and high value.
- Ensure that all ESD staff participate in performance evaluations per contract and state law by July 1, 2016.

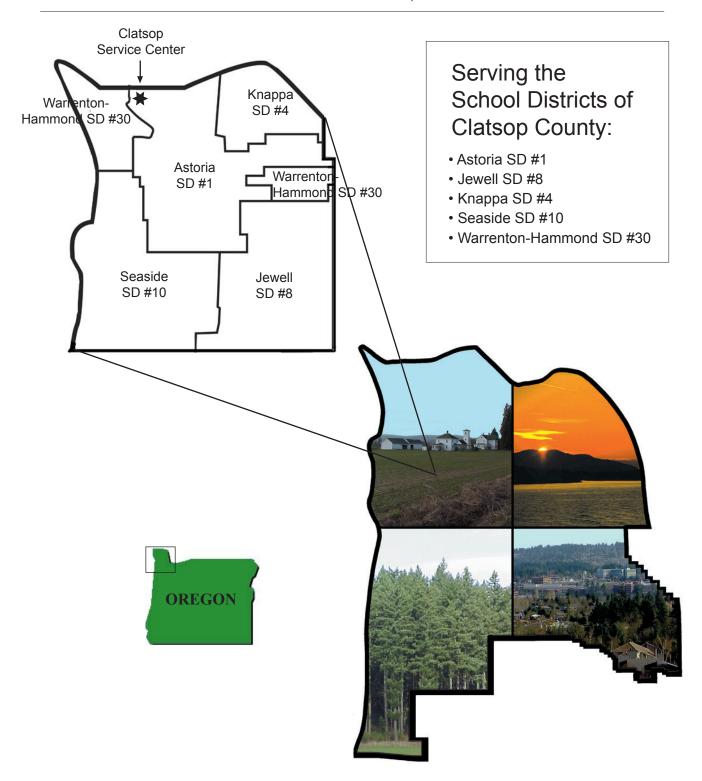

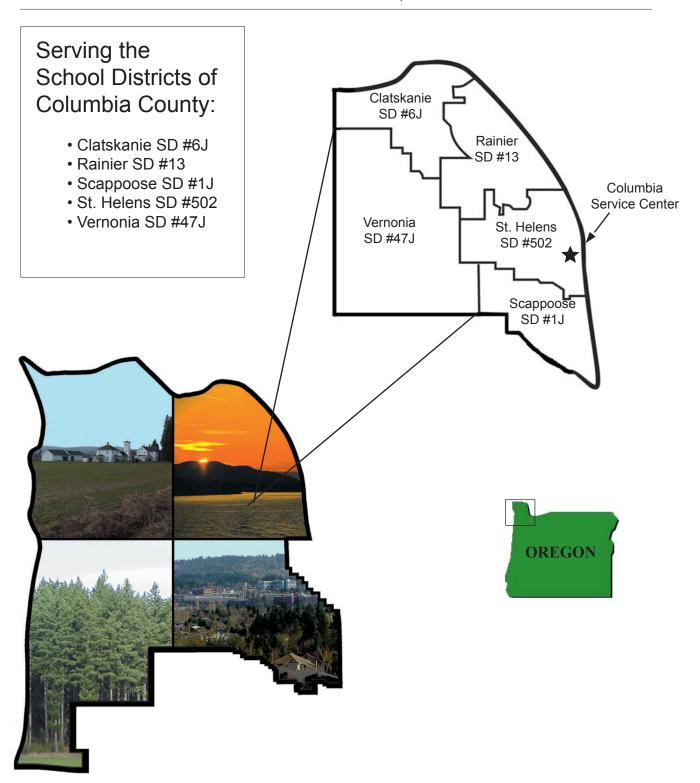

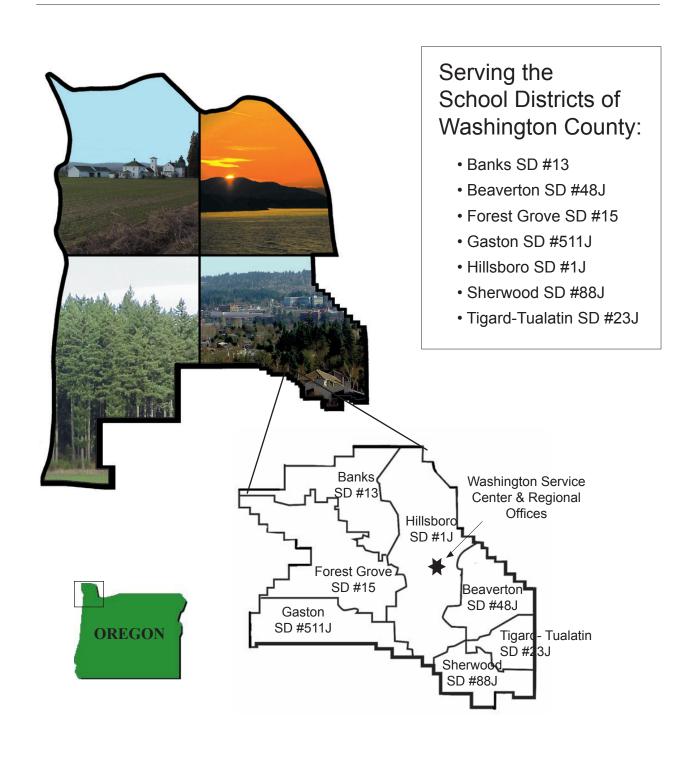
