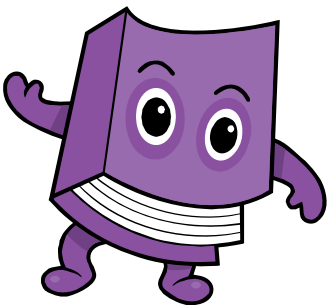


SENIOR CLASS PARENT MEETINGS & SENIOR PICTURES
