APPROVE AGENDA:

A motion by Grizz Medina to approve the April 21, 2010 Agenda as presented was seconded by Harvey Sanchez and passed 5-0.

CONSENT AGENDA:

We understand that "classroom set" is defined as the total count of SBOE adopted textbooks on the conforming or nonconforming list necessary to provide one copy to each student during the class period. This definition includes SBOE-adopted print textbooks and electronic textbooks. Individual districts will decide the number of SBOE-adopted textbooks that make up a classroom set.
- That for each subject in the required curriculum and each grade level, this district provides each student with textbooks, electronic textbooks, or instructional materials that cover all elements of the essential knowledge and skills adopted by the State Board of Education for that subject and grade level.
- 4. That if this district or charter school purchases supplemental textbooks with textbook credits under the Texas Education Code, Chapter 31.035. (d)(2), these supplemental textbooks, in combination with any other textbooks or supplemental textbooks used by the district or school, will cover the essential knowledge and skills identified under §28.002 by the State Board of Education for the subject and grade level for which the district or school is requisitioning the supplemental textbooks.
