Is AVID for you?

What is AVID?

AVID stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination and is a regularly scheduled elective class that prepares students in the middle, with academic potential, for success in rigorous classes in middle and high school and in college.

What are the expectations for an AVID student?

- Maintain an average of "C" or above (2.5 GPA overall)
- Practices good citizenship and has good attendance
- Maintain an organized binder
- Willing to learn or maintain oral language and public speaking skills
- Use the Cornell Note method of note-taking in all classes; on their own
- ➤ Willing to become part of a team of students for positive peer identification
- > To increase coping skills and self-esteem
- Develop or maintain higher-order thinking and critical problem solving skills (inquiry)
- Participate in the AVID tutorial process
- > To implement and use organizational skills
- To learn or maintain respecting deadlines in all classes
- Communicate with each of their teachers about their current progress in each class

What happens in the AVID elective class?

- 1. Students receive academic support based upon proven AVID methodologies (WICOR); writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading.
- 2. Students receive academic support through collaborative tutorial peer groups; AVID tutorial process.
- 3. Students are motivated to pursue academic excellence through goal setting, challenging (rigorous) classes, cultural and collegiate field trips (subject to funding and/or positive AVID Status), classroom speakers, and AVID team building.

What are the expectations for an AVID parent?

- Encourage their students to achieve academically
- Maintain regular contact with the AVID teacher
- Become involved in the activities of the AVID program

Make sure that you understand what the AVID program is.

It is an elective class that takes place during the regular school day and you must always be prepared to work hard, communicate, and put forth your best effort.

If you are not willing to commit to this, then AVID may not be for you.
