Four sessions were held in October with staff. Definitions were given for Equity vs.

Equality and an understanding on how they apply to the school as well as our lives.

Equality is the idea that everyone is given the same resources and opportunities to thrive.

Equity recognizes that everyone is not the same and resources are made for individual needs

Equality video was shown – Diversity means differences in all respects

Equality is fairness

Equity is based in access and opportunity

7.D.2. Building Equity Highlights

Loves Park – Awareness Month – looked at different themes and developed activities

"Everybody Thought" – A book that classes read and then did activities and group reflections on their different perceptions.

Machesney

Maple – Social Emotion learning activites to be aware to be our best selves

Marquette – talked about paying attention to people around you with an activity to see what each other has in common and which things are not

Olson Park – classrooms made lanterns

Parker Center – Equity team did a candle fundraiser and bought books i.e. "I live with Down Syndrome" and others, to show differences. They also did a Black History display at the front entrance

Ralston – January theme of engagement and included it in the word of the week with presentations by third grade students and students making sentences with the word engagement in them and then read over the loudspeaker

Rock Cut – Zion is a 4^{th} grade student with an IEP, recommended to be placed a therapeutic day and then moved here instead and we took time to get to know the parents and student and gain their trust to work together, and his iReady was at 175% in math and 35% in reading

"Be curious, not judgmental" by Walt Whitman

Windsor – Difference not Deficit – speech language pathologists met with them to discuss what the report would sound like to families as students with African American English speech difference was lower than others that used standard English, they discussed how to

score these things to be equitable. Some assessments recognize AVE but they do not account for it.

High School – Black History Month board was done, January 17 had Dr. Junco came and presented to staff all day on a sense of belonging. Added weekly E team meetings to help support each other and a formal E Team meeting each month, multi-cultural activities to promote kindness. Buddy basketball was held for kids that would play on the special Olympics team and it is a cool event and a great community event. Buddy Dance is Friday night.

Middle School – trying to take work from the E Team and bring to the whole staff. We give the presentations on the themes at faculty meetings for staff, Student Equity Team is working on the 4 agreements, 6 conditions and understanding the compass and facilitating conversations amongst themselves.

Kindness week starts tomorrow with a special Olympics presenter for staff
