Defining Alternative Education

Narrow Definition:

VS

Broad Definition:

Encompasses educational programs and systems that expand upon the traditional K-12 model, often designed for specific student populations or needs.

Program Highlight: BARC

(Beaverton Academic Reengagement Center)

Success Seminar Class Period

Students who can complete credits during one class period of Success Seminar (up to 1.0 credit of target recovery per semester, 2.0 credits for the year)

BARC Partial Day Program

BARC Counselor is invited to an Options Meeting and can talk to student and family about BARC as an option.

Beaver Lodge - LTM & Testing Center

LTMs are grading & creating targeted work for select courses.

BARC provides testing space during Beaver Lodge for:

- Work Samples
- WorkKeys Tests
- STAMP
- ProGrad Pre-Testing

Credit Recovery

Program Highlight: FLEX Credit

Who we serve

HSS funded for eligible
9-12 students:

- Need support to stay on track to graduate
- At risk of not graduating due to credit deficiency
- Need course to graduate not provided by home site

What we offer

We work with students
districtwide to support:

- Rolling enrollment
- Online coursework
- Asynchronous and/or 1:1 support
- Collaboration with neighborhood site
- Shareable courses/content

Taught by BSD teachers and
aligned with BSD standards:

- Original Credit
- Repeated Course
- Credit Recovery
- GED/ Test Prep
- Summer Advancement Courses
