*Carlin Friar* – Provided a report from the bond oversight committee. The committee received updates on the aquatics learning center and the BMSS expansion. The 2022 bond projects are closing out with 22 complete and 6 substantially complete. A CTE program update was also provided to the group.

*Carlin Friar* – Provided an update from the safety and security meeting. The group discussed safety & security trends, security audits, memorandums of understanding, national honor guard academy and upcoming trainings.

**Sarah Faulkenberry** – Provided a report from the SHAC committee. The group reviewed the committee's purpose and accomplishments, recommendations for student technology guidelines

at home, health and wellbeing services and the continuation of innovative family fitness and nutrition initiatives. Also discussed, the possibility of a community garden at the share and care center.

**Dallas Pipes** – Provided an update from the P-tech cybersecurity meeting. update. There are currently 166 students enrolled with many students on track for either an associates degree or level 1 certificate.

*Kristi Schmidt* – Reported that PTO presidents met on October 3. Mr. Goodrich provided information to the group regarding a parent presentation on the dangers of social media. Mr. Guerrero reviewed the process for campus modifications. Dr. O'Hare provided the group with a BOA update. The Thanksgiving pie day is scheduled for November 20 and senior walks will be held May 18.

**Courtney Darter-Bruce** – Provided an update from the P-tech health science committee. The group discussed industry-based certifications currently available and plans for additional industry-based certifications in the future.

**Sarah Faulkenberry** – Provided a report from the facilities committee meeting. The group received updates on bond projects and a FORES fence update.

*Garrett Wilson* – Provided a report from the communications committee meeting. The group received updates from the NSPRA communications audit, community engagement improvements and a renewed emphasis on including BISD students in communication initiatives.

Garrett Wilson – Provided an update from the finance committee meeting. Topics of discussion included the efficiency audit, quarterly investment report, and the unintended consequences of HB2 on our funding. BISD is one of nine districts that did not get additional funding from HB2. Moak Casey is representing the nine districts and there is a possibility that the state could remedy this situation in the future but that is uncertain at this time with no updates expected until sometime in 2026.
