Bull Buffalo Immersion: this month, we began preparing for the Christmas program by learning our songs. All the students sang Jingle Bells in Blackfeet. Our December BNAS theme focused on buffalo and the story behind our school's name, Stumitsikitsikin-Bullshoe. We explored the different types of buffalo and learned how they adapt to the changing seasons throughout the year.

Fox Children Immersion: The first-grade BNAS theme is "Goods and Products." My students and I have been focusing on cultural foods, learning the names of different foods in Blackfeet and creating sentences to incorporate into our lessons and writing activities. We've also been exploring traditional beadwork, discussing its various styles and

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techniques. Lea from the BNAS Department kindly emailed to ask if any staff needed materials from the Trading Post, which allowed us to gather supplies for beading. Soon, my students will be learning how to bead. We are excited to bead projects in the upcoming New Year!

BNAS Specials (Jocelyn/Kortni): In December, our focus was on learning the Blackfeet language and visited topics such as animals, numbers, colors, and other vocabulary. Looking ahead, we are excited to begin our next unit on Winter storytelling, where we will explore more about Napi and his adventures.
