Mr. Erlebach read a prepared statement regarding the Nehalem Elementary Swim Program. Mr. Erlebach stated that swim lessons will continue for 30 minutes each week, it will be the same next year as it has been this year. There will still be 90 minute literacy blocks along with the math blocks four days a week. The statement is attached to these minutes.

Ms. Woika stated that she went through many drafts, but she found a way to make it work. She said the schedule for next year is still a work in progress due to the fact that she does not yet know what teachers will be teaching. Mr. Kelly clarified that students would have 30 minutes in the water, commute and changing time is in addition to swim time. The Board thanked Ms. Woika and Mr. Erlebach for all their time and effort to make the swim program happen. Compromises were made by both North County Recreation District (NCRD) and Neah-Kah-Nie School District.

Nancy Smith stated that this year they had to fight for the swim program. Is this something that we will have to do every year? Mr. Erlebach stated that for us it was not a fight. We collaborated with NCRD to create a schedule. Ms. Smith stated that she has never seen the swim program on the chopping block. Mr. Erlebach and Ms. Hooley stated that the swim program was never on the chopping block. Ms. Hooley added that it might have changed, we are putting academics first. We were putting literacy first, making sure that all of our children have every opportunity to succeed. Because of the scheduling, it might have been more of a major change. We were never getting rid of the swim program stated Ms. Hooley. Ms. Woika and Mr. Erlebach have gone to extraordinary effort and time to make it work.

Ms. Smith stated that she has never seen the swim program so interrupted as it has been the past two weeks and would they have to fight for the swim program. Mr. Kelly stated that he hoped not, and that it is all settled now. He further stated that the first and foremost concern of this Board is the academic success of our students. That is what parents expect of the Board.

Jack Bloom, Chairman of the NCRD Board, stated that this has actually been a good thing NCRD as well as the Neah-Kah-Nie Board and the community. Their ambitions were to finish the theater, finish the parking lot and ultimately build a new pool. This discussion has authenticated how staff, families and community feel about the swim program.

Mr. Kelly asked if there would still be blends, she said there would be 6 straight classes and perhaps 3 blends. They are also beginning English/Language Arts (ELA) SBAC test tomorrow.

Neah-Kah-Nie High School Child Development Class / Preschool Lab: Corey & Angie Douma

Mr. and Mrs. Douma shared that this presentation came from a conversation with Mr. Erlebach about the Child Development program and how the program has grown to include teaching assistant's from Mr. Douma's class. Mr. Douma stated that the high school offered a human development course from conception to adolescence. As part of the class his student were able to observe children on a very limited basis.

Ms. Douma shared that she has taught at the elementary level for years and thought that preschool would be no problem. It rocked my world, stated Ms. Douma. She shared with Mr. Douma that she needed more bodies in the room to manage students. This is how the preschool teaching assistant program began. High school students are required to have taken the Child Development course, students are then recruited by recommendation and encouragement from high school staff and through observation of their interaction with the preschool students.

Mr. Douma shared that his students have the opportunity to put into practice what they have learned in his class, observe preschool staff deliver lessons, and learn to develop and deliver lessons themselves through a lesson plan developed by Ms. Douma, as well as delivering a lesson that the student created based on the soon to be rolled out Early Learning Standards.

A look into the future

Mr. Erlebach stated that a majority of staff that he has talked to think it is a good idea to improve the track.

Seismic Grant Update: Steve Baertlein - absent

Mr. Erlebach stated that the district received the \$1.4 million grant for the seismic upgrades to Nehalem Elementary School. We submitted the same grant for Garibaldi Grade School, but that would be for the next grant cycle. There is a short timeline by which the project must be completed. The work is scheduled to begin this summer.

Neah-Kah-Nie School Board Candidate Interview Questions

1. Welcome, thank you for applying for the vacant position on the Neah-Kah-Nie School District Board of Directors. Please share with the Board your background and how your life, education, and professional experience will benefit the Board?

Ms. Aeder shared that she has been coming to board meetings for 23 years. This is a good board to participate with, very pro education, started as a bus driver 25 years ago, became the manager 23 years ago and has served the district as the transportation manager for all of that time.

- 2. Please share with us why you are interested in the Board position?

 Ms. Aeder shared that it occurred to her that she attends board meetings anyway. She explained that she has served on other boards, and appreciates a board that works well together.
- 3. Are you aware of the time commitment required to serve on the Neah-Kah-Nie School Board?

 Ms. Aeder shared that she is aware that it is probably more than the time she spends here. She realizes that board member volunteer to be on committees and there are at times extra meetings
- 4. What is the role of a school board member?

 Supporting and overseeing the superintendent, carry out the wishes of the board and district policy.
- 5. If you find that you have a conflict of interest concerning any district operations, how would you declare that?

 Ms. Aeder shared that she realizes that she will have a conflict of interest with the negotiation of the First Student contract occurs, as well as any parent issue. She shared that she would remove herself from discussions or decisions.
- 6. What is one problem the district is currently facing that you believe you could help with?

 Ms. Aeder did not see any real issues. The district embraces PBIS and has included bus drives in PBIS trainings. She would like to see that continue to grow. Ms. Aeder stated that she would also like to see better communication between bus drivers and teachers.
- 7. Do you have any questions for the Board?

 Ms. Aeder asked if, during winter weather, the board would have an issue with her leaving early, since she would need to

check roads. The members agreed that would not be an issue.

Mr. Kelly asked where Ms. Aeder grew up, she shared that that she grew up in Northwest Portland. She also shared that her husband owns Sundance Trading Company.

The Board concluded there interview with Ms. Aeder. Ms. Aeder was asked to leave the room while the members conducted their deliberations. The board, by way of consensus, agreed to appoint Ms. Aeder to the Board.

The work session concluded at 6:25 p.m.

Yes, swim lesson duration (30 minutes) and frequency (1 time a week) will continue to be the same next year as it is this year, for Nehalem Elementary students. There will also be 4 days of 90 minute uninterrupted reading blocks and 1 day of a mix of uninterrupted and interrupted reading blocks, in addition to the current math blocks. High literacy and math skills for all students continues to be the main goal of the Neah-Kah-Nie School District.

The Board's directive on February 29 was to enhance the District's literacy program with 90 minute uninterrupted literacy blocks. Remember, "uninterrupted" does not mean kids sit immobile at their desks for 90 minutes. "Uninterrupted" means literacy is the highest priority in the school schedule. We were also directed to collaborate with our community partner NCRD to create a swim schedule that would continue to provide swim lessons for all students. Initially, we did not know what this schedule would look like or if it were even possible. After regularly meeting with NCRD and reviewing a variety of options, we came up with the best solution. Coming up with viable solutions, and keeping the "eye on the prize" takes time and focus. We met the Board's directives.
