Creating Digital Content for Learning (Modified Flipped Classroom) 5 hours - 1/2 Board Credit 20 seats - available to all teachers grades 5 - 12 February 19 and 26. March 5, 12, and 19

Providing students with anytime, anywhere learning is important as learners continue to move into the 21st Century. In this course, teachers will be introduced to what a Flipped Classroom can look like and how this style of teaching different? Teachers will also be given the opportunity to create through screen casting and post lessons in iTunes U for students to access with their iPads.

For this course, we will also be employing a blended learning model. In this format, teachers will only meet face-to-face for the initial and final learning session. The remaining weeks will be conducted online including a product to be submitted each week and a discussion topic to post their thoughts and ideas.
