line. There are directions from the school website. Using ParentVue can prevent "unwanted" surprises.

Absences can and will affect grades, class rank and grade point average. A large number of absences will affect academic progress more than any other factor. Therefore it is very important for all students to attend school regularly.

I want to thank our entire parent support base, and all those who made this fall a special season for the entire school and community. We wrapped up fall sports with much success and now the winter sports seasons are upon us. I especially want to thank those that attended our Hall of Fame and Auction on November 15th. This fundraiser went well as the money earned on this night was significant in supporting the Booster Club and all students.



Mark your calendar...December 17th 6:00 p.m. in the HVHS Commons. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the form used by the Federal Department of Education to determine a student's eligibility for student financial aid. This evening is parentfocused. You will receive valuable information about FAFSA, how to fill it out, deadlines, grants, work study, loans and financial aid in general. What you can do now:

Go to www.pin.ed.gov to register for a PIN. Your PIN serves as your e-Signature for the online FAFSA. Download the FAFSA on the Web Worksheet to preview the questions you may be asked on the online FAFSA. Also, save time by completing the FAFSA forecaster @ www.fafsa4caster.ed.gov
