4-day week: reb additional think tank information attached. Was not intended to be the staff survey but information from district leadership team and principals, directors, instr coaches, sbe committee to plan for 4-day week. Developed a survey inclusive of all employees and committee and students. The attached is from all employees, their questions and some not answerable yet, other positives and potential negatives. Did not receive from all depts and buildings but was sent to all. This survey follows policy of 180 instructional days. Asking to send out survey

to community (all school staff and browning public). Will go out via bps facebook page and physical at diff locations. Havre only got 500 responses back and that is not sufficient for this. It cannot be based on work place decision. For bps make good solid decision and need 2000 responses, have to get out into community. Survey was sent out to leadership team and board members. If approved tonight will have out by end of week and bring back to end of April meeting with the policy. Jimmy lot of diff feelings on this. In dc visited with harlem and haves, small schools, there was a lot of pluses and negatives, but only saved money on their gas fueld buses and bps has propane. If board wants survey out, will do it and if don't want it, we won't. Lockley thoses schools say scores are rising and students and staff feel more refreshed in hayes. Harlem is 50/50 on the issue. Bps is lowest in state and suggest try something diff. jimmy a big factor is kids that don't get to eat for 3 days. Bps is their only meal. We talked about this 4 years ago. Dyo have no problem with survey going out to community but board will determine after. Will have to be persuaded unless there is diff information on this. Read u of m from 2008 – 2023 that shows educ scores went down and costs went up with 4 day; it was a 5 day that kept them good. Mike hoyt stated he read the same and talked about previously where there is an 8% increase. There is a mile long list of pros and not a lot in there for students. Kids not eating on weekends it is an additional day of no meals, or safe haven for them, and don't feel will help test scores. Brian move forward with survey, big issue is social emotional and wellbeing of kids and needs of our students who go to someone in our schools and they won't be available. Mike move forward with survey, 2000 responses would be solid number. Jimmy can move forward with the survey. Mike when taking survey important to keep in mind how students are going to benefit;; would love a 4 day week but does not work for his program. Keep in mind this is for the students. James street lights, transformer, from food service to highway. Reid food service and out to highway. Jimmy is it possible to move the lights from old to new field. Reid will look in to but feels may be too old.
