As spring approaches, many of our classrooms are beginning to take field trips and have class activities that may require parent involvement. After your application has been completed you will receive an email from Jenny after you have been approved with directions on the final steps to the process. <u>Please take into consideration, that this application process may take up to 2 weeks to be completed, so plan accordinaly.</u>

A lot of times parents do not know how to support their student in education, but parents can get involved by creating opportunities to teach, to be models, and to guide their children at home. **Families whose children are doing well in school display some key characteristics**. The top 2 things parents can do at home to support their child academically are:

Establish a daily family routine

Examples: Providing time and a quiet place to study, assigning responsibility for chores, being firm about bedtime, and eating dinner together

Monitor out-of-school activities

Examples: Set limits on TV watching, checking in with kids when parents are not home, arranging after-school activities and supervised care

These are just a couple of things parents can do at home to get involved with their child's education.

<u>Please keep supporting your student(s) in doing their best on a daily basis at school.</u>



You must provide documentation of the updated shot record or exemption module completion form prior to this date. If you do not, your student will be excluded from school until one of those forms are obtained.






1) We can NO longer accept soup labels. We are still taking the Box Tops though and appreciate ALL your help with this.

2) If your child needs to take medication at school, please make sure you stop by the office to fill out the appropriate paperwork. This includes any

over the counter items like **cough drops**, antibacterial ointment (Neosporin) etc.

- Fidget spinners are NOT allowed here at school, PLEASE leave them at home. This applies to all toys except for show and tell days.
- 4) School starts at 7:35 Monday-Thursday and 8:35 on Fridays. Kids aren't allowed on campus until 7:15/8:15 respectively. That is when our cafeteria is open and we have staff here to watch them.
- 5) If your child is missing a coat, backpack, mittens etc., you are more than welcome to check our lost and found bins in the gym. We just ask that you stop by the office to sign in and get a visitors badge..
- 6) If you have any questions, complaints etc. regarding the bus company, please call them directly at 541-476-7733.
- 7) We have a new attendance program that is sending out letters automatically. These letters will go out regardless if your child's absences were excused or not. We have an attendance problem in the Valley and we are trying to address it and make all parties involved aware. If the Principal thinks there's an issue he will schedule a conference with you.
- 8) It is cold and flu season and we are doing everything we can here to keep the germs at bay. If your child is sick with a fever, vomiting or diarrhea, please keep your child home for a full 24 hours after the most recent occurrence of illness.
- 9) Along those lines, if your child is out for 5 or more days due to illness, we will need a Dr.'s note. If it's less than 5 days a note from home will suffice.
- 10) Please remind your child to check in at the office and get a Tardy slip if they are late.
- 11) If you want to bring a treat for your child's birthday, please arrange with the teacher in advance.

Child Find for Special Education

Public Law 105.17, known as the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), requires that school districts provide a free and appropriate education to all disabled children and young adults from birth through 21 years of age. The Three Rivers School District requests assistance with the identification of any disabled children ages Birth through 21 who are not enrolled or currently being served in one of the District's schools.
