INNOVATIONS:

- Campus wide implementation of Google Classroom and Google Applications for Education suite of tools
- Spanish students are working with Google Classroom on a daily basis, while learning how to work in an web-based classroom environment.
- PAP Algebra 2 and Algebra 2 (Mrs.Walton, Hardin, and Kidd's classes) used the TI Inspire App on the classroom set of ipads to discover domain and range of various functions and explore special cases of linear equations and inequalities.
- PAP Algebra completed a mini-project where they set a goal and described and illustrated their goal using set notation, internal notation, inequality notation, a number line and a cited image. The assignment was given and submitted through google classroom.
- Medical Interventions students created SuperBug bacteria resistant to two different antibiotics
- Human Body Systems identified the skeleton of a missing person using forensic anthropology of the bones and DNA analysis to compare bone DNA to that of two missing persons.
- Principles of Biomedical Science Crime Scene investigation
- Mrs. Hardin's and Mrs. Wyatt's geometry students recently completed the project Truth in Advertising. The students researched a career as a creative director exploring some of the aspects of the career such as job functions, required education, and potential earnings. Students analyzed and presented through digital media an existing marketing message by

- rewriting the message as a conditional statement as well as the converse, inverse, and contrapositive statements that might be related or implied.
- In the Financial Mathematics course, the students had to come up with a potential new business they would want to own and operate. They had to write a business proposal, create a spreadsheet and charts outlining and totaling the capital needed to start their business, and then lastly had to create a presentation as a pitch to potential investors. I was impressed by many of the projects I received. They all had to submit the assignments through the google classroom and they have adapted well to the new platform. Lastly, due to the autonomy and freedom they had with the project, I have seen projects done on many different platforms such as excel spreadsheets, prezi, powerpoint, keynote, word, google docs, imovie, smore.com, google sites, and glogster.com. It has been fun to grade them and see their creativity which can sometimes be stifled in a math class.
- Students are learning how to complete simulation software in the fields of business, finance and marketing that they will use as part of an online DECA competition in October.
- PreAP Chemistry Students completed a PBL defending scientists of the Atomic Theory and Presented them to their peers.
