Mustangs Giving Back



In November, supported our students and community through multiple food initiatives. Thanks to generous teacher contributions and food drives by our students, we distributed over 2000 grab-and-go bags and large totes of food on Friday 11/7, Friday 11/14, and Tuesday 11/25 before break. Overall, November was a strong month of collaboration and generosity, and we're grateful for the support that allowed us to reach so many students and families.

Mustang Momentum Challenge Winners



This fall our students participated in the Mustang Momentum Challenge. Between October 14th and November 14th, students who maintained an A, or A's, in their math, science, social science and/or English courses AND students who improved their grades were entered into a raffle. The prizes included airpods, a Morton Under Armor winter hat, jacket, or backpack, movie tickets, Bluetooth speakers and more!

Of the eligible students, 1,271 individual students maintained A's in at least one of the aforementioned courses for a total of 1,964 A's (each one of these receiving a raffle entry). In addition, 1,198 students improved their grades in at least one subject area, with a total 1,465 total entries for improvement. Overall, 2,033 students improved their grades or maintained an A.

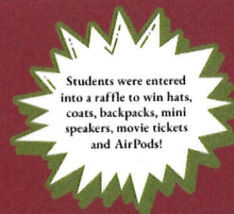
Attendance Matters

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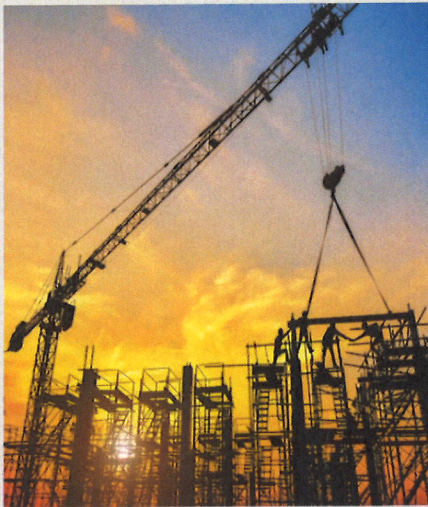

Architectural Services

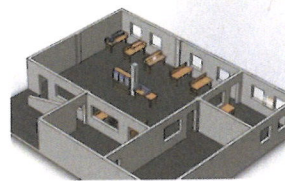
- Architect contract alignment ongoing; next steps are review and signatures.

OCIP
