

## **Existing Family Reference Guide Language**

### **BICYCLES**

Students are permitted to ride their bicycles to school, provided that they follow all appropriate safety rules and regulations. Students must walk bicycles across streets and on school grounds. *Students may not ride their bikes on school grounds and should walk their bikes on school sidewalks and playgrounds.* Bicycles should be locked in the racks at the front of the building. The school is not responsible for bicycles taken from the racks.

## **NEW Proposed Family Reference Guide Language**

### **Personal Transportation Guidelines**

For the safety of all students, staff, and visitors, the use of personal transportation and recreational equipment on school property is restricted. Our priority is to maintain a safe, welcoming environment, and we appreciate your cooperation and partnership in this effort.

#### **1. Prohibited Use on School Grounds**

- No person on school property or at school-sponsored activities shall drive, ride, or operate personal transportation or recreational equipment, whether **manual or electric**, including bicycles, scooters, skateboards, rollerblades, hoverboards, or similar items at all times.
- “Non-highway vehicles” such as dirt bikes, golf carts, and ATVs and UTVs are strictly prohibited on school grounds at all times.
- Exceptions are permitted only for reasonable accommodations under the **Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)**. Please talk with your building principal if you require these accommodations.

#### **2. Rider Responsibilities**

- Those who ride personal transportation to/from school must obey all applicable safety rules and regulations.
- Riders must **walk** bicycles, scooters, skateboards, or other equipment across streets and while on school property (including sidewalks and playgrounds). This applies to both manual or electric transportation.
- The school will not store items inside the building. Therefore, it is strongly recommended that all equipment be secured in the racks provided at the school.
- The District is not responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen property.
