Dear Rotary Duck Derby Program Selection Committee:

Hidden Valley High School is proud to announce the creation of a new athletic complex and a five year construction plan. Through a 1.2 million dollar grant from the Community Sports Development Council and with generous community sponsorships and donations, our high school has been able to finish phase one and two of a five phase project that includes professional grade crum rubber athletic turf for our baseball, football, soccer, and softball fields. These fields will be coupled with a state of the art tennis court development that includes six courts and athletic complex bathrooms that will serve all four facilities. We have finished our football/soccer field, and our baseball complex was finished last spring. We are hopeful to start phase three- which is our softball facility this winter so it can be completed for the 2016 season. We have been awarded two grants to help with this cause as well as gained some monies from generous partners and families over the past year towards this cause. Currently, we own the turf but we still need to purchase the crum rubber and complete site prep this winter for a completion date of March 10th, 2016.

Currently, we have raised over \$650,000 in two years towards our endeavor. This money has secured the completion of the football/soccer, and baseball fields. We have a significant commitment from community partners to complete our softball field this winter as we have recently secured an additional \$20,000.

Specifically, The Duck Derby Program will help finish our goal of raising the \$27,828.48 needed to complete our softball facility. Our community has illustrated their desire to see this project to completion as evidenced by the amount of cash and in-kind gifts that have been given by selfless people. Progress monitoring of this project is coupled with our school district maintenance director, the Josephine County Education Fund, the Three Rivers School District School Board, and myself as the project manager. This new complex will change the way athletics are played at our school and in our valley. It is where we will host events that benefit our school and community in many ways.

The \$27,828.48 requested will finalize our fundraising for the completion of our softball field so timelines with planning can occur. Please consider our application as it will have a positive outcome on our school and the lives of countless students.

Project Description:Turf and Tennis Athletic Complex that includes Football/Soccer/Baseball/Softball fields and a six court tennis facility was awarded a 1.2 Million dollar grant from the Community Sports Development Council to turf all three fields with in-kind construction commitments from the community. We have raised over \$650,000 to date towards the project. This athletic complex will be a destination for our entire community. There are many adult and youth programs that may or may not be connected to programs here at Hidden Valley that would gain large benefit from these improvements. Specifically, we are requesting \$27,828.48 to complete our softball turf project. Timelines will be to complete this project by March 10 <sup>th</sup> , 2016. Capital Expenditure:\$825,000								
The past Duck Derby money that was awarded to Hidden Valley was used to pay off the all-weather surface track here at HVHS. This \$73,529 was the first of 0% interest money that was loaned and paid back to the Grants Pass Foundation with derby money. This phase of our athletic complex was completed in 2008 and the last payment was sent in 2009. Derby money was paid out to HVHS over four years to pay off this loan and help improve the existing facility. In 2006 we received \$33,500, in 2007 \$30,500, in 2008 \$27,197, and in 2009 \$8,803.

Comments: Our students are always involved in the annual duck scrub and the Hidden Valley High School Interact Club
continually works to support service learning along-side the Rogue Gateway Rotary club. To date, we have over \$50,000 in cash and
in-kind support to help finish the softball field. This vision, planning and the effort of an entire community has come together to finish this
great cause for students here at Hidden Valley and community members of the greater Rogue Valley. If we can get a commitment from
the Duck Derby Program, we will explore loan options with our ASB to complete the project this winter. Worse case, we will finish in the
late fall of 2016 if our ASB cannot cover the loan amount requested in this grant.

Applications must be submitted to one of the four (4) Rotary Clubs of Josephine County and received no later than November 6, 2015.

Applications are reviewed by the Derby Committee for approval. In all cases, the decision of the Committee is final. If an applicant is not successful, it should not be construed as disapproval of the work of the submitting organization or of the worthiness of their project. The Rotary Clubs may receive many more applications than it can fund.
