Purpose of Report

This report submitted to the Board of Trustees will reflect updates of the Child Nutrition Programs for 2018-2019 school year and the impact of this data in 2019-2020.

Objectives

- Review federal policy of what makes up a reimbursable meal
- Provide an overview of the implications of increased participation and outcomes for the current school year

Operational Impact

An increase in breakfast and lunch rates for current school year:

School Breakfast Program	18-19	19-20
Elementary Breakfast	\$1.10	\$1.20
Secondary Breakfast	\$1.35	\$1.45
National School Lunch Program	18-19	19-20
Elementary Lunch	\$2.75	\$2.80
Secondary Lunch	\$3.00	\$3.10

Universal Free Breakfast offered at the following campus locations: Alexander ES, Borman ES, Evers Park ES, Ginnings ES, Hodge ES and Rivera ES.

The addition of Cafeteria Monitors into the Child Nutrition Department has alleviated the demands on campus administration as it relates to staffing and scheduling.

Results

We have seen increases in meal participation with breakfast up 25% and lunch participation up 12% districtwide for September.
