Administrator's Report

- CESA Jan. PAC Meeting Presentation was regarding <u>poverty</u> & emphasized how little we know about living in poverty. Many of us at the meeting felt that we lived in poverty as we were growing up but the kind of destitute poverty we see today is more prevalent than 40-50 years ago. Considering that and family conditions puts a different spin on why some students do not get assignments in, etc.
- 2) COPES Training: Sharon & I attended and have been trained. The question is whether the board wants the district to include all evaluations of certified staff in the CESA#6 EE model. Sharon & I think that should be the path to follow but it will include training and an understanding of the process with all Central Office administrators and possibly directors. The regular system only includes teachers and principals. DAPES for superintendents is coming so all could be the same.
- 3) WiRSA (Wisconsin Rural Schools Association): I just received an e-mail from Jerry Fiene advocating for Tom Beebe's request for support of WPEN (Wisconsin Public Education Network), which is the invoice I had previously mentioned that others were also not supporting. Jerry says, "You have received requests for support and financial assistance for the network from Tom Beebe and WAES. I continue to strongly encourage you to support this effort with your involvement as well as some level of financial support. The work of the network is very supportive to the work of WiRSA.
