busin solar acces Partic	mmunity solar project is a shared, large-scale solar energy system in which multiple customers, such as individuals, lesses, and nonprofits, can subscribe to receive credits on their electricity bills for the power generated by the shared array. Unlike traditional solar that requires installation on one's own property, community solar makes clean energy ssible to everyone, including renters and low-to-moderate income households for whom rooftop solar is not an option. cipants receive bill credits for their share of the solar energy produced, providing financial and environmental benefits jut installing panels on their homes.
How	<u>it Works</u>
1. Sh	ared Solar Array: A central solar farm is built to serve multiple customers in a geographic area.
2. Su	bscription: Participants subscribe to a "share" of the solar system's output over a specific period.
	I Credits: The electricity generated by the shared array provides credits on the subscribers' monthly electricity bills, cing their overall costs.
	ling: The community solar farm then bills the district for 90% of what was credited, resulting in a savings of 10%. For ct 33, this is estimated to be about \$38,000 per year.
