Highlights:

Two seniors completed their graduation requirements in December.

Approximately 51% of students schoolwide improved math skills; 78% reading; and 61% improved language usage skills in the last 12 months.

Five students will be traveling to NYO Regionals in Barrow at the end of the month.

Goal 2: All students perform at or above grade level

Tutoring in five classes for one hour day, three days/week has been happening since October 2024 and will continue throughout next year. Learning gaps are closing. Students are improving in reading fluency, numeracy, and language usage.

Current preschool and kindergarten students are starting 4th quarter with more foundational reading and numeracy skills that last year's cohort demonstrated at this time last year. We now have systems in place to monitor math skills in kindergarten through second grade.

The math interventionist is working with small groups and individual students K-12. Approximately 51% of students have shown growth in math in the last 12 months.

Goal 3: All students are prepared for their pathway of choice post-high school

Parent-Teacher conferences March 20-21

ANSEP opportunities were expanded to 5th graders this year.

Three juniors and one senior attending career fair.

Several students have participated in CTE sessions through QLC, Alaska Excel, and Voyage to Excellence. These opportunities allowed students to take a variety of courses we are not able to offer at Kali currently, such as basketball referee certification, heavy equipment operating, video production, cosmetology, and aviation.

Goal 4: Graduate bilingual students

All Kali students preschool -12th grade have instruction in Inupiaq daily. Ilisaurri Lola teaches preschool and Kinder-third grade. Ilisaurri Julie instructs 4th-12th grade and a middle school cultural arts class. Also, teachers are using Viva and/or Ivalu to learn.







