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Oki, BMS enjoyed a very fun, productive, and safe of month of November. We have fully implemented the foundational components of our instructional framework as evidenced by our BMS Walkthrough data collection system. Our goal of making the allotted class time, 45 minutes, as effective and efficient as possible continues to be our main focus. There have been four main components to making this 45 minutes as rigorous and relevant as possible. Those four main components include: BMS Instructional Framework, BMS Staff PD, BMS MBI, and Retention. We have also added Retention to our list of academic vocabulary words and discussion topics with our students. This fourth component will be the main objective for our Advisory Classes. Advisory Class is every Friday morning and within this class students will answer the Essential Question of: How do I create a plan to avoid Retention? The students will calculate their G.P.A. and evaluate their ISIP, Star Math, and social/emotional data to set SMART Goals which they will then use to guide their efforts in their daily class schedule. Teachers have been provided the foundational PD throughout the 1st quarter in helping students evaluate, monitor, and assess their data.

ELA and Math both have 70 minutes so they have further foundational components to implement including the Study Sync curriculum. We have very recently began the process of completing paperwork for the new Montana Comprehensive Literacy Plan. We are planning on using these funds to further enhance subject literacy and authentic literacy in all classes.

We continue to work with our Math consultant. The Math Dept. is working on implementing Number Talks and other forms of grade level instruction using multiple teaching strategies to enhance the student's preparation for high school. The current objective is that regardless of where the student's score on their testing, they will all be exposed to grade level math concepts in all classes. We have used our SSG Funds primarily to enhance our iPad usage by purchasing apps and t.v.'s that the teachers and students can use with their Apple Connect technology. We have also rebranded our math study hall as a math intervention class. The students in this class were handpicked as they are near the top of Tier 3 with the opportunity to move up to the Tier 2 cutoff. The objective is to instruct this class using grade level curriculum and standards. The students will be instructed in three separate groups for 15 minutes each. The remaining time will be used independently by the students to practice these skills.

The SRI Grant continues and we are making excellent progress in implementing our Tier 2 and Tier 3 vocabulary strategy. The SRI grant was originally designed to be used in one class of the teacher's choosing. The teacher then monitors the student data for that class while implementing the KIM Model. The SRI Team, in conjunction with the SLT and AVID teams, decided to make this strategy a school wide strategy. The teachers in all classes are now expected to use the AVID KIM Vocabulary strategy within their Interactive Notebooks to improve all of their student's vocabulary and reading comprehension. This is being monitored in all classes as teachers are required to complete the 5 Step Binder Check process in all classes once per week.

We continue to emphasize ethics and professionalism with our staff in meeting all of their expectations. We are also continuing our commitment to consistency and listening to our students as we become a trauma sensitive school. Our bullying issues are dealt with as soon as they are reported and they are thoroughly investigated with proper consequences handed out to all students involved in the bullying circle. This improved and safe learning environment is allowing our students to fulfill their number one expectation when coming to school everyday and that expectation is to learn.
