# INTERVENTION PROGRAM 2008-2009

### PERFORMANCE GOAL:

To improve student achievement of every student

## PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES:

- 1. To promote students with at least 5.5 credit hours to the high school at mid-semester
- 2. To contract and meet with parents of students with 0-5.5 credit hours
- 3. To provide credit recovery classes to all students with 0-3.5 credit hours and have them to complete at least 3 additional credits hours
- 4. To contact and provide TAKS tutorial classes to all 12th grade students who failed the TAKS and did not graduate
- 5. To provide credit recovery classes to 12<sup>th</sup> grade students who have passed TAKS but have not earned 26 credits.
- 6. To identify and contact all 2007-2008 dropouts and provide classes for them to complete school

#### FORMATIVE AND SUMMATIVE EVALUATION:

- 1. 95% of the 9th Grade Center students with at least 5.5 credit hours will be promoted to the high school at mid-semester
- 2. 100% of the 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Center students with 0-5.5 credit hours parents will be contacted and provided assistance in needed areas
- 3. 9th Grade Center Credit Recovery program will be implemented by the end of September
- 4. 95% of the 12th grade students who failed the TAKS will be contacted and provided TAKS tutorial classes
- 5. Credit Recovery classes will be offered all (100%) of 12<sup>th</sup> grade students who have passed TAKS but have not earned 26 credits.
- 6. 100% of the students who dropout of school in 2007-2008 school year will be identify and contact. An attempt will be made to offer them classes to complete school

Status at 9/23/2008	Parent meeting was held at NGC to inform parents of Credit Recovery Program. Credit Recovery sessions began on September 13, 2008. Approximately 40 students are currently attending credit recovery sessions and obtaining credits. Additional students are being added as they request and agree to terms of contract. Student grades are being monitored every 3 weeks and students. Parent conferences and regular counseling are being held with students whose grades, attendance, or behavior put them in jeopardy of not being promoted.
