The NBPTS provides a national, voluntary system of certification based on a set of rigorous teaching standards in each subject field. Certification is achieved through a demanding, performance-based assessment that typically takes at least two years to complete. There are now 110,000 teachers nationwide and over 6,000 teachers in Illinois who have earned National Board Certification. Illinois ranks sixth in the total number of teachers who have achieved National Board Certification since the inception of the program.
