

How Important is Sleep?

Students and teachers obviously have a lot of responsibility related to school. The students' parents also have a very important role to fulfill. By following these tips, parents can help their kids better succeed at school.



Make Sure Your Kids Get Enough Sleep

A child is in kindergarten should be getting 10 hours of sleep each night.

Not getting enough sleep can cause many different problems. You know that when your child is tired he or she can be grumpy and emotional. There are other problems that aren't as obvious. Being overtired makes it easier to get sick. In school, students who are tired have a harder time paying attention, and they have a harder time remembering what they are supposed to be learning.

For many students, school starts early in the morning. Activities, television, and computers make it easy for students to be wide awake late into the night. The end result? Tired students.

Aim for your child to go to sleep around the same time each night and to get up at about the same time every day – even on the weekends. Having an established sleep schedule will make it easier for the student to get the sleep he or she needs.






