During that process, the proposed resource (Three Cheers for Pre-K) was thoroughly evaluated during multiple meetings, and using the Vicksburg Community Schools Instructional Materials Evaluation Tool (IMET), it met each required Indicator of Superior Quality for each non-negotiable criterion. Based on that evaluation and related discussions, the proposed change is to replace the current instructional resource with Three Cheers for Pre-K from Savvas. This resource includes aspects of both digital and traditional materials for both students and the instructor. The new resource will allow the BK course to support each child's social and emotional well-being, physical growth, and academic readiness, which aligns with our goal of providing a well-rounded education that prepares students for success in various fields.
