BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The closure of the Belt Line Intermediate campus at the end of the 2010-11 academic year creates the need for new intermediate school attendance zones. With the considerable assistance of the Districts' demographer, Population and Survey Analysts (PASA), staff presents the attached maps for consideration as possible options for 2011-12 intermediate level attendance zones.

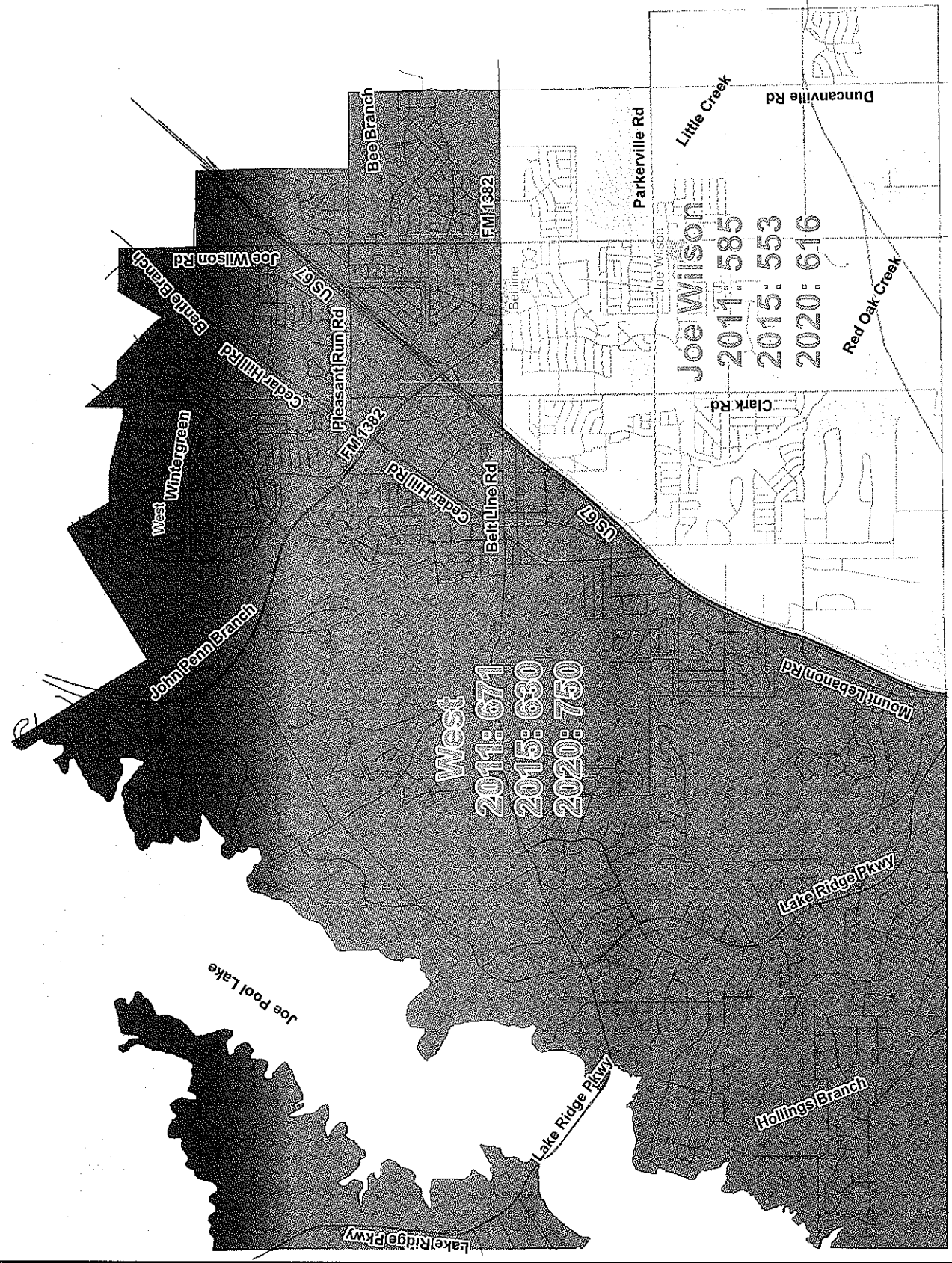

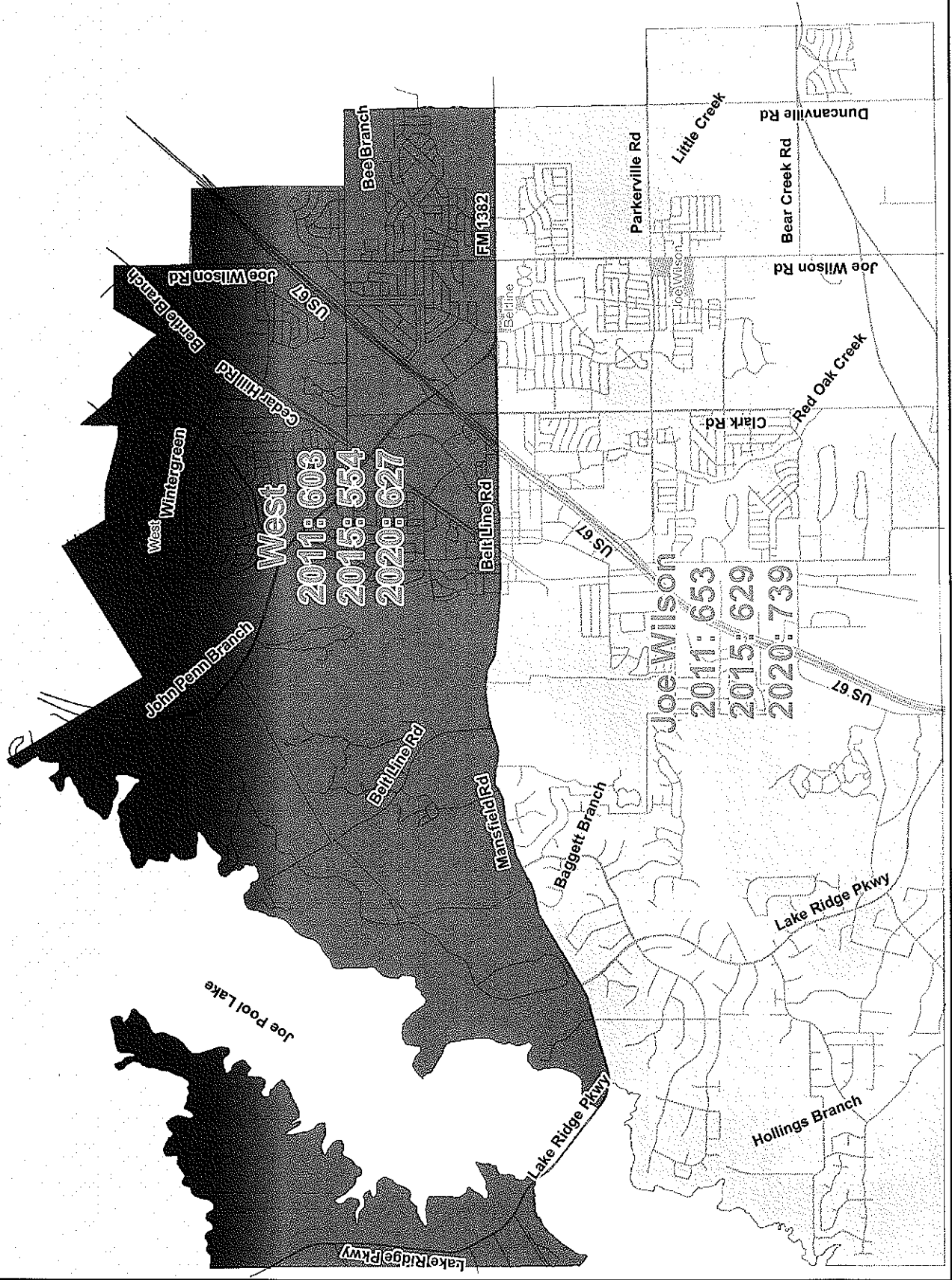

Option 3A map

Pros

Bray students moving to 5th grade, no change

Plummer students moving to 5th grade, no change

High Pointe students moving to 5th grade, no change

Waterford Oaks moving to 5th grade, no change. W.O. has always split when progressing to Intermediate level. Geographically, that split remains the same, except split is now between West and Joe Wilson, instead of Belt Line and Joe Wilson.

Joe Wilson students moving to 6th grade, no change.

Highlands students moving to 5th grade would no longer be split between Intermediates. They would remain together at Joe Wilson.

Cons

Lake Ridge students moving to 5th grade will now be split. Most will go together to West. The triangular neighborhood bounded by Hwy 67, Parkerville and Clark Rd. will go to Joe Wilson.

Former Belt Line students moving to 6th grade will be split. Most will go to West with the exception of those in Highlands, north of Weaver St.

West students moving to 6th grade will be split. The neighborhood bounded by Hwy 67, Parkerville and Clark Rd. will go to Joe Wilson.

Projected enrollments between West and Joe Wilson are not optimal, but can likely be controlled through the transfer options available to CHSD parents and non-resident teachers.

Option 3B map

Pros

Bray students moving to 5th grade used to split between West and Belt Line. They will now all stay together at West.

Plummer students moving to 5th grade, no change.

High Pointe students moving to 5th grade, no change

Waterford Oaks students moving to 5th grade, no change. W.O. has always split when progressing to Intermediate level. Geographically, that split remains the same, except the split is now between West and Joe Wilson, instead of Belt Line and Joe Wilson.

Highlands students moving to 5th grade would no longer be split between intermediates. They would remain together at Joe Wilson.

Joe Wilson students moving to 6th grade, no change.

Future Middle School rezoning: Option 3 B would also serve exceptionally well as the zoning map for the two middle schools beginning Fall 1012. Using PASA projections, Permenter and Coleman would have almost identical enrollments at about 610 students each. Under 3B, all West 6th graders would move together to Coleman and all Joe Wilson 6th graders would move together to Permenter.

Cons

Lake Ridge students moving to 5th grade would all go to Joe Wilson. They formerly all went to West.

West students moving to the 6th grade would now be split. Those residing south of Belt Line / Mansfield Rd. would move to Joe Wilson.

Projected enrollments between West and Joe Wilson are not optimal, but can likely be controlled through the transfer options available to CHISD parents and non-resident teachers.
