

Parents as Teachers

- Received Blue Ribbon Affiliate Status meeting 81 model standards in Fall 2024
- Expanded play groups from 1 site to 11 sites
- Provide sensory screenings including hearing and vision to all Imagine Preschool students
- Helping Grant 814 Families assisted \$1,179, 747.17 given to families in need
- Kinder Kits available to all Title 1 Students in partnership with the United Way of Southern Arizona. The value of the kits is over \$20,000 in books and learning materials for our future kindergarten students.









(Educational Community Home Outreach)

The ECHO Program at Nash provides a community school-based approach to achieve student success by tackling academic and non-academic barriers through after school programs, new learning opportunities for students and their families with wrap around health and wellness resources.

Why?

- No-cost after school activities will entice students to attend class
- Programs provided after school until 6 pm include tutoring, snack and dinner, sports, STEM activities, Yoga, music classes, reading and math clubs

- 2 years at Nash
- 75% of Nash students attend
- 10% decrease in absenteeism
- 12% increase in test scores
- Decrease in behavioral issues
- 86% of caregivers said they can get a better job or work more hours because of ECHO
- 100% of caregivers took comfort in knowing their child was safe and
 learning after school

Coming September 2025 - ECHO will be starting at Keeling and Prince Elementary

From October 2024 to February 2025, the following products have been given to our families:

- 2,061 diapers
- 688 period products
