The Kindergarten Partnership Innovation provides supplementary funds for Early Learning teams within each Washington County school district. These teams are composed of District Family Resource Managers, school representatives, and community partners. Priority areas for use of these funds include professional development for parent education curriculum, kindergarten readiness, and family engagement. Washington County Early Learning oversees the funding contract. The grant window begins January 1, 2016 through June 1, 2017.

The Secondary Career Pathways Funding was established by the Oregon Legislature in 2015 to incentivize intensive CTE Programs of Study that lead to high wage and high demand occupations. Allocations are based on students enrolled in the prior school year who earned three or more credits in an approved CTE Program of Study that leads to a high wage and high demand occupation. Additional funds are allocated for students earning three or more credits if they are also either historically underserved students or have earned an industry-recognized credential.

Talent Search (TS) is designed to support and assist middle and high school students from disadvantaged backgrounds to progress through the academic pipeline from middle school to attainment of a postsecondary degree. The program provides academic, career and financial counseling to its participants and supports their graduation from high school and enrollment and graduation from a postsecondary institution. This is a competitive renewal of a currently funded, successful program. Schools served by PCC in this five year project are Aloha, Beaverton, and Hillsboro high schools and Mountain View, Meadow Park and South Meadow middle schools.
