CURRENT DRUG-TESTING PROGRAM

- All students involved in athletics between grades 9-12
- Signed consent to participate
- Intended to serve as deterrent
- urine test conducted multiple times per year
 - Approx 100-150 students tested each time
- Positive tests do not result in school punishment
 - Consequences in athletics, including missing competitions
 - Counseling resources

Drug Testing

PROPOSED DRUG-TESTING PROGRAM CHANGES

- All 9-12 students involved in all UIL and select extracurricular activities (to be determined)
- Signed consent to participate
- Intended to serve as deterrent
- urine test conducted even more times per year
 Approx 100 students tested each time
- Positive tests do not result in school punishment
 - Consequences in athletics, including missing completitions
 - Counseling resources
- Inclusion of single-panel nicotine urine test among random sample of those selected each testing round

Drug Testing

ADDITIONAL NOTES

- As a part of Update 113, FNF (Local) will be amended
- Details of program related to scope, collection procedures, notification of positive tests, and consequences will all be moved from FNF (Local) to Administrative Regulation
- Budget impact anticipated to be approx. \$3000 more than 2018-2019 budget amount
- Total number of students in pool expected to be approx. 1,250 (or 72% of all students in 9-12); prior pool has been approx. 800 students
- Addition of random nicotine tests intended to address use of vapes and e-cigs
- Consequences for additional activities are to be determined (will be outlined in Administrative Regulation prior to start of school)
