Public Hearing for School First Rating Report Vicki Garcia, Executive Director for Financial Operations presented the District's School Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas "FIRST" Report for the year ending June 30, 2020.

During the 77th regular session of the Texas legislature (2001), Senate Bill 218 was passed, and Governor Perry signed it into law shortly thereafter. This law requires each school district to prepare an annual financial management report within two months of the date of issuance of the final School FIRST ratings. The District received official notification of the 2020-

2021 Preliminary School FIRST rating on August 6, 2021. The purpose of the financial accountability rating system is to ensure that school districts will be held accountable for the quality of their financial management practices and achieve improved performance in the management of their financial resources. For the nineteenth year in a row, Denton ISD continues its financial excellence with a rating of "Superior Achievement" for the 2019-2020 fiscal year, scoring positive responses on all 20 indicators and an overall score of 98 out of 100.

Some of the indicators the District is rated on is:

- 1. Annual Financial report filed by deadline to TEA
- 2. Unmodified opinion on annual financial audit report
- 3. Compliance with payment terms of all bonded debt agreements
- 4. Timely payments to state and federal agencies (TRS, IRS, TWC, etc.)
- 5. Total unrestricted net asset balance >0 in governmental activities
- 6. Amount of sufficient day of cash on hand

Career & Technology Education Annual Report Carla Ruge. Director of CTE and Dr. Christina Herrera presented an overview regarding Denton ISD Career and Technical Programs, including legislative highlights, funding, CTE Renovation programs, demographic information and program performance which will include

the LaGrone Academy. CTE enrollment continues to increase as total enrollment increases which will provide additional weighted funding for the district. The district received additional Middle School weighted funding for high school credit courses which will help to maintain and support our middle school courses. This year Weighted funding has changed to a Tiered system per class. CTE continues to offer over 40 Programs of Studies that are tied to high demand occupations and student interest. The ATC has an 86% pass rate for certification and licensing. The ATC is partnering with US Aviation to offer a private pilot and aircraft mechanics courses. Additional new courses are the Dell Tech Help Desk Program, InCubator Program and the Esports Program.

Discussion & Review of Employee Grievance Regulations Deron Robinson, General Counsel provided the Board of Trustees an update to the Denton ISD Administrative Regulations reflecting a change to the Employee Complaints/Grievances process. Currently, an informal process is in place encouraging all employees to meet and discuss concerns and/or complaints with their direct supervisor. If no resolution is reached at this informal meeting, an employee may submit a formal written complaint.

A formal process was added to the Administrative Regulation to state that once a complaint is filed, the lowest level administrator who has authority to remedy the alleged complaint shall serve as the Level One Hearing Officer. In the event a Level Two complaint is filed, the Level Two Hearing Officer will not be the direct supervisor of the Level One Hearing Officer. An additional change is that Level One and Level Two hearings may be held in-person or virtually, as agreed upon by the parties.

Discussion & Review of the HB 3 Teacher Incentive Allotment

Jason Rainey, Executive Director for Human Resources reviewed the Teacher Allotment that was discussed prior to the pandemic. The purpose of the Teacher Incentive Allotment are: Recruitment, Equitable Distribution of Effective Teachers, Retention

- Local Education Agencies (LEAs), if they choose, can designate high performing teachers as Master, Exemplary, or Recognized based on statewide performance descriptors for these designations.
- LEAs will receive \$3,000 \$32,000 per year for every designated teacher they employ.
- LEAs receive greater funding for designated teachers who work on rural and/or high-needs campuses.
- At least 90% of the Teacher Incentive Allotment funds must be used on teacher compensation on the campus where the designated teacher works. The remaining funds could be used for costs associated with

- implementing the local designation system or to support teachers in obtaining designations.
- National Board-Certified Teachers will automatically earn a Recognized designation.

HB 3 Teacher Incentive Allotment is fully funded by the Texas Education Agency. Further, 90% of TIA funds received by the District must be allocated, for compensation, to the assigned campuses of the teachers earning the designation. The 2021-2022 school year will be the application process and approval by TEA. Year 2 – 3 will be the System Approval with a Designation approval at a later date.

Denton Central Appraisal District (DCAD) Board of Directors Nomination Report The Denton Central Appraisal District (DCAD) has requested its taxing jurisdictions to nominate up to five people to be considered for their Board of Directors. According to Section 6.03 of the Property Tax Code, it is the chief appraiser's responsibility to initiate this process. The chief appraiser does not have the authority, or duty to investigate, or judge, the qualifications of the nominees. The nominations must be returned to the Denton Appraisal District by October 15, 2021. An individual that is serving on the governing body of a city, county, or school district is eligible to serve as an appraisal district's director.
