- 1. Totaling the number of IB / AP courses successfully completed.
- 2. Computing the GPA of all IB / AP courses successfully completed.
- 3. Computing the weighted grade average to a sufficient number of decimal places to break the tie.

If the tie remains unbroken, covaledictorians shall be declared, and no salutatorian shall be recognized. Should a tie remain for salutatorian, all those with tied GPA's shall be recognized.

In the event of a tie among the ten top ranked high school graduates, GPAs shall be figured to a sufficient number of decimal places to break the tie. All other ties shall remain, with tied students receiving the same ranking and skipping the next position before continuing with the next ranked student (e.g., 28 of 550, 28 of 550 then skipping to 30 of 550).
