Discussion of City of Denton Summer Camp Programming Megan Thomas, Program Area Manager for the City of Denton provided an update on Summer Camp. The City operates an all-day summer camp for 9-10 weeks in the summer; Monday-Friday, 7 a.m.-6:30 p.m.

In 2023 the City and Denton ISD worked together to expand the City's Summer Camp program to utilize additional DISD school sites and transportation services. Through the collaboration in 2023 the following additions were made:

- Increase camp capacity by approximately 164 spots per week.
- Added onsite amenities with access to DISD gyms and playgrounds.
- Increased safety utilizing professional drivers through DISD transportation services.

Denton ISD sites make up 57% of the City's all-day summer camp program and an additional 36 spots per week will be available in 2024. The City and DISD continue to work together to explore additional expansion opportunities to meet the needs of the community.
