I. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- A. Approval of Virgil Knowles as Temporary Chairperson to Convene this Meeting through Action Item III. A. 1: Election of Officers A motion for approval was made by Callen and supported by Forsyth.

- B. School Board Recognition Month Supt. Glaes recognized the board members and expressed appreciation for their dedicated service to Vicksburg Community Schools.
- C. VCSF Annual Report General Warren Lawrence reported the yearly highlights of the Vicksburg Community Schools Foundation and shared the 2016-2017 Annual Report with the Board.
- D. Introduction of New Staff Principals
 - Julie Sorenson Principals Hook and Barwegen introduced Julie who is the new Guidance Counselor at Indian Lake Elementary (3 days/week) and Tobey Elementary (2 days/week). She comes to VCS from Comstock Public Schools.
 - Erin Clark Principal McCaw introduced Erin who is a new Kindergarten Teacher at Sunset Lake Elementary. She comes to VCS from Kalamazoo Public Schools.
- E. Legislative Update Supt. Glaes discussed the Consensus Revenue Conference final report from its meeting in May 2017. School Aid Fund is up, but economic pressure from a declining General Fund is likely to result in a small per pupil increase next year. We will know a bit more after the Governor presents his budget plan.

MPSERs 3% refund of health care contributions will be returned to Districts by January 22, 2018. Asst. Supt. Goss gave an update on how and when the funds may be returned.

House Bill 5393 would amend the Revised School Code to provide that, beginning with the 2017-2018 school year, school districts, intermediate school districts (ISDs), and public school academies (PSAs) could not bar a student from participating in interscholastic athletic activities because the student transferred to the district, regardless of the reason for the transfer. Supt. Glaes shared concerns about the bill.

Supt. Glaes explained the resolution supporting the School Finance Research Collaborative. It was decided to table this agenda item until the next meeting, after the report is published.

F. Important Dates – In addition to the listed dates, Supt. Glaes announced there will be a Bulldog Bounce at Indian Run Golf Course on February 24, 2018, sponsored by the Athletic Boosters.

The budget amendment will be presented at the next Board meeting.
 - 2. Bond Update Asst. Supt. Goss discussed the bond expenditures from the first two series. Money left from those series will carry over to series three. Asst. Supt. went through the bid process and the bids received for the next phase.
- B. Positive Action + Positive Thinking = Success HS Principal Keevin O'Neill presented on what VHS is doing to support the District's mission and vision. He shared information about the programs and opportunities for the students of VHS and answered questions from Board.
