Neah-Kah-Nie Middle/High School Community Track Proposal, Matt Koehler of Cameron McCarthy Landscape Architecture & Planning

Mr. Kelly called the work session to order at 5:07 p.m. Mr. Erlebach introduced Matt Koehler of Cameron McCarthy. Mr. Erlebach stated that when we began developing the capital improvement plan, we noticed that the high school track needed some work. He shared that Matt Koehler met with a group of district staff to take a look at the track and to prepare a proposal for the board to consider.

Work Session Notes

Mr. Koehler shared that his firm does a lot of K-12 work, designing everything outside of the buildings. His firm is currently working on 15 school projects. His specialty is the field aspect of the project. They help schools and school districts look at the big picture, also how to work out funding details.

Mr. Erlebach asked what is wrong with our current track. Mr. Koehler stated that the rubberized surface of our track is gone, and the base is breaking down, student liability will very soon become an issue. Our track has enough wobbles and cracks that we could have athletes sustaining injuries.

Mr. Koehler reviewed the three proposals, the cost of the three proposals range from \$1.4 million to \$3.6 million dollars. He was also asked for a proposal for a six lane track. Which he did, however he indicated that six lane tracks are not that common. A six track would cost approximately \$1.2 million dollars.

Ms. Buckmaster stated that she would like to promote an eight lane over a six lane track, it would allow the high school to run track meets more efficiently and hold district meets as well. Discussion occurred. Mr. Koehler's proposals are attached to these minutes.

Mr. Kelly told Mr. Koehler that the Board usually likes to take some time to consider any proposal. He let Mr. Koehler know that the board would get back to him after they have had some time to consider all the options.

Mr. Kelly adjourned the work session at 6:24 p.m.


