Purpose of Report

To request that the Denton ISD Board of Trustees, through the attached resolution, calls on the Texas Legislature to repeal the rating system utilizing A through F grades for schools and districts and allow the development of a community-based accountability system that empowers school districts to design their own internal systems of assessment and accountability. In addition, any new system proposed should reduce the use of high-stakes, standardized tests, encompass multiple assessments, reflect greater validity, and, more accurately reflect what students know and can do in terms of the rigorous standards.
