A. ACTION ITEMS

1. Excursion Field Trip Request – Crestwood High School

Attached is an Excursion Field Trip request from Mr. Matt Ridenour, Crestwood High School Band Director, for his high school band students to travel to Central Michigan University to take part in their annual Band Day for marching band. The requested date is September 13 through September 14, 2019. See Attachment 8.A.1.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the Crestwood Board of Education approve the excursion field trip request from Mr. Matt Ridenour for the Crestwood High School band students to go to Central Michigan University on September 13, 2019 and returning on September 14, 2019. As per Attachment 8.A.1.

2. Dearborn Heights Vocational Education Partnership Agreement

The 2019-2020 Dearborn Heights Vocational Education Partnership Agreement is being presented for approval. The purpose of this agreement is to allow Crestwood, Dearborn Heights NO 7 and Westwood students to enroll and attend Career Technical Programs operated by each of the school districts. In addition, this agreement will allow Crestwood, Dearborn Heights No 7 and Westwood students to be placed in Westwood Cyber High School or Ombudsmen and Advanced Placement courses at Crestwood High School. Executive council determines the program components on an annual basis, which are modified as necessary.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the Crestwood Board of Education approve the 2019-2020 Dearborn Heights Vocational Education Partnership Agreement as presented on Attachment 8.A.2.

3. **Williams' Early Childhood Services Agreement**

The 2019-2020 Williams' Early Childhood Services Consulting Contract Agreement is being presented for approval. The purpose of this agreement is to have an Early Childhood Specialist Consultant to assist the Crestwood School District in the fulfillment of the Michigan Department of Education Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP) grant requirements. The consultant agrees to fulfill multiple duties and responsibilities inside and outside the classroom. The duties may be amended at any time during the agreement period through written agreement of both Crestwood School District and the Consultant. See Attachment 8.A.3.I

RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the Crestwood Board of Education approve the 2019-2020 Williams' Early Childhood Services Agreement as presented in Attachment 8.A.3.

4. **Lease Agreement between The Salvation Army and Crestwood School District**

The lease agreement between the Salvation Army and Crestwood School District is for the purpose of operating the Alternative Education Program for the Crestwood School District students.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the Crestwood Board of Education approve the 2019-2020 lease agreement between the Salvation Army and Crestwood School District.
