- 170 students—nearly 50% of the student body— qualified for the 1st trimester Cougar Trek. To qualify students needed to have no referrals, 5 or fewer tardies, and 90% or better attendance.


Santa Claus will also deliver a Christmas breakfast and toys to the elderly and disabled that are homebound.

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2009/2010 ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS

Straight Line Routes For: Illinois Valley, Lorna Byrne, Evergreen

In the event of adverse weather conditions parents are advised to tune in to Radio Stations KRWQ, KAJO, KLDR, KBOY and TV Stations KOBI (5), KDRV (12), KTVL (10) or the 3 Rivers School District Web Page for information on school bus schedules.

Sometimes weather conditions leave some roads blocked or unsafe to travel but school is still being held. Under these circumstances "straight line routes" will be run. This is the information you will get on the web page or radio/TV stations.

When straight line routes are run the roads affected are listed below.

If you live on one of the roads the buses cannot travel, you may bring your student to the nearest intersection of the main road traveled. This will also be the stop for the afternoon drop off.



IVHS's local scholarship packets were handed out to all seniors on Nov. 5th. Scholarship packets can be accessed online at IVHS's website. Go to the teacher pages, and then click on Ms. Tucker's page. Scholarship application materials can be typed and printed, and then turned in by January 13, 2010, to Ms. Barbara Gamble in Room 9. Seniors Planning on Going to College or to a Trade School *To Do List for Students (and Parents) Winter 2009/2010*

- File the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid): Each student and one parent must complete this application for a student to be eligible for federal and state college grants (free money!!). First apply for a PIN at www.pin.ed.gov. Both the student and one parent/guardian must have a PIN (your electronic signature) to apply for the FAFSA. As soon after January 1st as possible, complete the FAFSA at www.fafsa.ed.gov.
- Apply for the Oregon Student Assistance Commission (OSAC) Scholarships: This online scholarship application contains the Ford and Gear Up scholarships and many others. Complete the application at www.getcollegefunds.org. Early Bird due date 2/16/10. Final due date 3/1/10.

Two **FAFSA** and **OSAC** working sessions will be held at IVHS: Jan. 14th and Feb. 25th from 3:30-7:00 pm; and one on Sat. February 13th at the Kerby Belt Building from 1:00-4:00 pm. Financial aid and scholarship counselors will be available to assist students and parents, and to answer questions.

- VIVHS Scholarship Packet: The scholarship application is available in hard copy or online at www.threerivers.k12.or.us on Ms. Tucker's web page. Due date 1/13/10. Turn in to Ms. Gamble (Rm 9).
- Apply for RCC Foundation Scholarships: If possibly attending RCC, students should submit a RCC scholarship application. Apply online at www.rccfoundation.org. Due date 3/1/10.

Mr. Enoch will be teaching a **Scholarship Essay Writing Class** after school starting Jan. 19^{th} . This five session RCC class will be held on Tuesdays from 3:45-5:35 pm (1/19-2/16). There is a \$10 registration fee. To sign up, see Ms. Marsden in the Career Center. Students will receive one unit of RCC credit.
