I. CONTRACTING AGENCIES:

Performing Agency:	The University of Texas of The Permian Basin, an agency of the State of Texas

II. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this Contract is for Receiving Agency to obtain the services of Performing Agency to provide services for the Summer Bridge program. The program will prepare students for success in college through an interactive program of college readiness and will provide opportunities for ECISD students to take a summer class.

III. STATEMENT OF SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED:

Performing Agency will perform the following services:


- 1. Study Skills, and comprehension
- 2. Study Sessions for THEA, Placement exams
- 3. College survival skills

IV. WARRANTIES:

Receiving Agency warrants that (1) it has the authority to contract for the services under authority granted in Chapter <u>779</u>, *Texas <u>Government</u> Code*, and Chapter 771, *Texas Government Code*; and (2) the representative signing this Contract on its behalf is authorized by its governing body to sign this Contract.

Performing Agency warrants that (1) it has authority to perform the services under authority granted in Section <u>791.011</u>, *Texas <u>Government</u>* Code and Chapter 771, *Texas Government Code;* and (2) the representative signing this Contract on its behalf is authorized by its governing body to sign this Contract.

V. BASIS FOR CALCULATING REIMBURSABLE COSTS:



VI. CONTRACT AMOUNT:

The total amount of this Contract shall not exceed: \$ 10,250.00.

VII. PAYMENT FOR SERVICES:

Performing Agency will invoice Receiving Agency for services <u>upon complete</u> <u>performance of the services</u>.

In accordance with Chapter 771, *Texas Government Code*, Receiving Agency shall reimburse Performing Agency for services satisfactorily performed from appropriation items or accounts of the Receiving Agency from which like expenditures would normally be paid, based upon vouchers drawn by the Receiving Agency payable to Performing Agency.

XIII. TERM OF CONTRACT:

This Contract will begin on the Effective Date and will expire on July 31, 2009.

IX. TERMINATION:

In the event of a material failure by a Contracting Agency to perform its duties and obligations in accordance with the terms of this Contract, the other agency may terminate this Contract upon <u>thirty</u> (<u>30</u>) days' advance written notice of termination setting forth the nature of the material failure; <u>provided that</u>, the material failure is through no fault of the terminating agency. The termination will not be effective if the material failure is fully cured prior to the end of the <u>30</u>-day period.



<u>Targeted Audience:</u> Students who are recruited and selected by the district to participate.

<u>Method of Selection</u>: ECISD and MISD will take applications from students and will select up to 100 (50 from each district) to participate each week.

<u>Purpose of the Program</u>: The program will prepare students for success in college through an interactive program of college readiness. This should empower students to take charge of their own educational goals. Those who been accepted to UTPB could begin a college class on June 2 with regular college classes.

<u>Program Description:</u> Students will participate in a variety of activities designed to prepare the student academically, socially, financially and emotionally for college. Additionally, students will be given the opportunity to enroll in a college course for dual credit. Each student should plan to attend each day of the bridge program. Students will need to provide their own transportation to and from the university. We will provide lunch for students in the program. Students will be given the opportunity to take the THEA test and other exams needed before during and after completing the entire bridge program. The timing of the exams would depend on whether or not the student wishes to enroll in a college course.

Each high school student who attends the entire bridge program will receive a certificate of completion and a \$500 book scholarship to be used at UTPB for the freshmen year of college. This will be awarded at the awards luncheon. Other awards for activities throughout the week will be presented for the younger students as well. UTPB faculty and staff will conduct the workshops. Guests will include career professionals and ECISD representatives. Summer Bridge Students (juniors and seniors only) who wish to take a college course at UTPB would be offered a partial scholarship. Students who have family income of less than \$25,000 may be offered a full scholarship for one course.

Requirements:

- 1. Students will be at UTPB from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. each day Monday through Friday for a five day period. Those who graduated in the class of 2009 and seniors of 2010 and 2011 will participate from June 1-5 and finally, entering freshman and sophomores will participate from June 8-12 or June 15-19.
- 2. Transportation to and from UTPB will not be provided, so families of those students who participate will have to make arrangements for transportation to and from the University. The *Easy Rider* has frequent stops at UTPB for those who need transportation.
- 3. Dress is casual, but reasonable. Jeans and shorts are ok, but no short shorts, etc. On the last day a banquet will be held for students and their parents, so dressier clothes will be needed on Friday.
- 4. Students must exhibit professional, respectful behavior at all times. Inappropriate behavior will be cause for dismissal from the program.
- 5. Everyone will stay on campus for lunch, which will be provided. There is only a 30 minute time period allocated for lunch, so there is not time to leave during lunch.
- 6. Students will be expected to participate in all activities for all five days of the project in order to earn a certificate and a scholarship.

Purpose of the Summer Mini-Bridge Program

The purpose of the mini-bridge program is to provide a pathway to college for high school students. ECISD, MISD and UTPB are concerned that more Odessa students need to attend colleges and universities in order to help them prepare for the future. The bridge program will provide an on campus experience for students who have recently completed high school and for those who will be high school seniors next year. The program will give students an idea of what colleges and universities are like and what it is like to be a college student. They will be provided information on financial planning, including scholarship searches, applying for financial aid and managing job responsibilities with college classes. Students will learn college study skills and they will even visit a college major. They will find out about admissions, financial aid and other important offices on a college campus. With this knowledge, they will learn how to "play the college game" and survive in college.

All of the experiences are designed to help the student who is interested in attending college learn more about how to plan for college. The program is offered free of charge to MISD and ECISD students and graduates and all expenses are paid by MISD, ECISD and UTPB. Students are asked to complete the entire program for the five day period. Those who do not miss any sessions will be offered a \$500 scholarship to attend UTPB.
