Governing Board Presentation – December 8, 2015

Canyon del Oro High School has a 50-year long reputation of providing students with an excellent educational foundation to prepare them for post-secondary opportunities. The campus was built in 1962 and started as a middle school. CDO was founded as a public comprehensive 9-12 high school in 1964. The school is located in Oro Valley, Arizona, located 6 miles (9.7 km) north of Tucson at the base of Pusch Ridge. At one time, CDO had over 3000 students enrolled prior to the building of Ironwood Ridge High School in 2001.

During the AdvancED accreditation process, our school community realized that we did not have a strong mission and vision statement to direct the work we do together. Members of all stakeholder groups participated in a process to write new statements that are reflective of the work we do at CDO. Moreover, there are several key words and phrases in our mission and vision statements which align directly with the Amphitheater School District Values. The word innovative supports the values of creativity and curiosity. Our desire is to empower students to be knowledgeable aligns with the values of achievement and diligence. And finally, the concept of educating our students to be compassionate members of a global community and providing a supportive and respectful environment for all students are aligned with the values of caring, diversity, fairness, honesty, kindness, respectfulness, and service to the community. The remainder of this narrative will provide evidence to the various ways Canyon del Oro High School is committed to upholding and advancing each of the values of the Amphitheater School District.

The mission of the faculty and staff at Canyon del Oro High School is to provide diverse educational opportunities that empower students to become **innovative**, **knowledgeable**, **and compassionate members** of a global community.

The vision for Canyon del Oro High School is to be a model of excellence in secondary education through the use of **instructional best practices**, a **comprehensive and challenging curriculum**, and a **supportive and respectful environment** for all students.

The CDO demographic continues to change slightly over time. These are the current demographics:

These distributions have remained consistent since 2010-11 with the exception of a 6% increase in Hispanic students and a 6% decrease in White students.

Teacher Retention:

CDO only had 6 teacher positions to fill last year. These positions were due to the following reasons:

- Promotion to AP Position
- Went back to the school where they did their student teaching
- Family Health
- Retirement
- · Husband had to relocate
- Opportunity to teach in Dubai

CDO tends to be a school a school where most teachers want to be and where many teachers end up staying until retirement.

Student Mobility: Student mobility has improved over time since the 2010-2011 school year.

Focus for 2015-2016:

The following goals were collaboratively set with the CDO school community based on achievement data and AdvancED survey results:

- Communication & Parent Satisfaction: Increase the survey average score to 3.0 regarding the number of parents who report that teachers keep them regularly informed how their student is being graded.
- Graduation Rate: CDO will achieve a graduation rate of at least 91% during the 2015-2016 school year.
- Attendance: Increase the year end attendance rate from 90% to 92% during the 2015-2016 school year.
- Grading Procedures: Create three opportunities for facilitated conversations with a clear protocol regarding effective and common grading practices.
- Improved Math Achievement: 80% of continuously enrolled students will show growth on the CDO math assessment.

Professional Development:

- We have formed a committee to study student attendance trends and possible improvement strategies
- We also have a committee working on marketing ideas and strategies
- Review of research on effective grading practices
- Department collaboration to review achievement data and improve instructional practices
- Improved communication and transition to Schoolwires

Focus Programs:

The International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) approved Canyon del Oro High School to offer the IB Diploma Program, beginning in the school year of 2012-2013. The IBO is a non-profit organization dedicated to expanding students understanding of the world. Currently, there are more than 3600 IB schools in over 146 countries, nearly 800 of which are located in the United States.

The IB program is a rigorous two-year comprehensive curriculum for grades 11 and 12, which seeks to prepare students for post-secondary study through courses and instructional techniques that emphasize:

- Critical thinking
- Application of knowledge
- An interdisciplinary approach with a strong international focus

Students who have earned the IB Diploma attend prestigious universities throughout the world. Successful completion of the IB Diploma can equal up to a full year of college. However, the IB Diploma is really secondary to the skills students learn and the preparation they receive for their post-secondary plans. The IB Program is a key marketing tool at CDO and has helped us introduce our school to the community through various recruitment activities that we sponsor.
