- Ongoing professional development in SEL, including refresher training on function-based behavior and skills instruction
- Provide support and assistance to SRBI teams to implement academic tiered interventions
- Conduct an SEL screener
- Work with district SEL Committee to examining curriculum, interventions and supports at all tiers using the CASEL framework

Board Goal #4: Budget Development and Fiscal Management

Practice responsible budget development and management through transparency and maximize available financial resources through a balance of fiscal discipline and innovative educational investments.

<u>Pupil Services Department Goal:</u> The Pupil Services Department will aim to be fiscally responsible through careful identification of needs and appropriate spending to support student learning and growth.

- Examine PK-12 special education service delivery to support in-district programming for students
- Monitor caseloads and assignments of pupil services staff to ensure appropriate staffing and supports across the district
- Collaborate with neighboring towns (East Granby, Suffield, Windsor Locks) to explore cooperative program development
- Investigate the possibility of alternative educational programming within the Granby Public Schools
