I. Old Business

School improvement plan adopted indicators: The teachers of Williams joined the Site Council to discuss ways in which our school could improve on providing help to parents for supporting their students' education with inclass and at-home activities.

The site council's recommendations were discussed, as well as ways in which teachers could improve practice I this area. It was agreed that the teachers would meet as a Professional Learning Team (PLT) to identify ways in which they would "step up" their efforts for this important improvement indicator.
