DESCRIPTION:

This summer, Community Education (CE) will again offer referral only remedial reading and math classes using Targeted Services funding. These classes are taught by District teachers and are free of charge to in-district children. So far, 532 students were referred for reading and/or math or the tier three programs. Students who are referred for targeted services may also choose classes in the Sun Block program and use our centralized transportation from each of the District elementary schools.

KidKare students will also participate in the Sun Block program as part of their day and will choose from a wide variety of enrichment classes offered.

The Targeted Services and Sun Block program will be located at Parkside and Discovery Elementary Schools due to construction projects at BCMS. Classes will be held Monday - Thursday, 8:30-11:30 from June 20 - July 28.

Students attending CE summer programs will be offered breakfast and lunch at no cost by taking advantage of the USDA Summer Food Program. Thanks again to the efforts of Marilyn Splinter and the Food Service department.

In addition to the Sun Block program, CE continues to offer a full menu of activities and events for children and community members:
