Child Find Opportunities

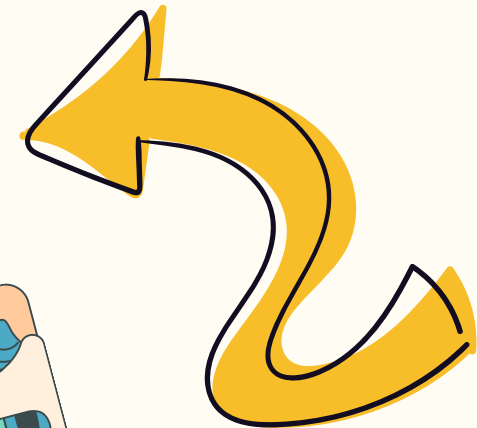

Child Find is a continuous process of public awareness activities designed to identify, locate, and evaluate all children with disabilities who may be in need of early intervention programs or special education as early as possible.

Children ages 3 to 21 may qualify for special education provided by local school districts.



Meeting New Families

Any families with children from birth to five are invited to come into the school for playgroup. On average 20-25 preschoolers come in with their families. Last month we welcomed five new families to our district.

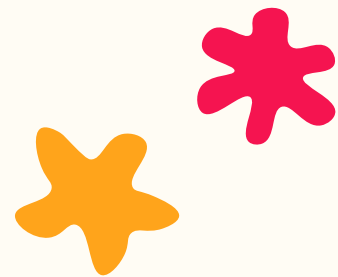
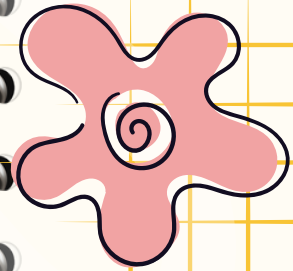
